**Activities to Achieve Goals**

**Goal 1: Educate and Empower Communities (Strong Communities)**

- Prioritize cross system engagement at state and local levels focused on enhancing community support for children and families.
- Ensure that programs and materials are available in a variety of languages that reflect community demographics.
- Engage entire community in building protective factors to support families and children.

**Goal 2: Strengthen Families (Health Families and Safe Children)**

- Provide a network of parent support within each community.
- Ensure all programs identify the importance of a father's role in the family unit and actively seek father engagement.
- Ensure cultural competency in all prevention programming.

**Goal 3: Expand Prevention Advocacy and Engagement (state and local prevention network)**

- Establish strong partnerships with all stakeholders invested in the prevention of child maltreatment.
- Coordinate statewide networking meetings for state and local providers to ensure cross system collaboration and engagement to further the child maltreatment prevention agenda.
- Sponsor training and technical assistance to child welfare and early care and education professionals on advancement and incorporation of protective factors into appropriate curriculums.
- Establish clearinghouse of child maltreatment prevention resources on the Ohio Children's Trust Fund website.
- Provide training and technical assistance to grantees to promote implementation of evidence based and/or promising practices programs and to ensure appropriate evaluation practices and techniques.

- Establish partnerships with multiple private entities to promote child maltreatment prevention.

**Goal 4: Create and maintain a strong OCTF infrastructure (money, people, processes and outcomes).**

- Deliver a statewide needs assessment that clearly identifies areas of need, target populations, and identifies successful trends in addressing the identified areas.
- Partner with public universities on evaluation.
- Develop and maintain a public/private funding portfolio to implement the strategic plan.
- Research additional sources of state revenue.
- Identify and maximize federal and state funding resources.
- Increase available leveraged funds for CAPTA Title II Grant.
- Advocate for increased state investment of available resources for prevention of child maltreatment.
- Demonstrate a commitment to Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) through implementation of a CQI system.
- Request state audit to ensure appropriate financial and programmatic accountability for public stakeholders.
- Invest in building a stable, educated and effective board.
- Build capacity for evidence based and promising practice programs in Ohio.
- Complete statewide needs assessment and logic model tied to outcomes for state and local prevention programming.
- Invest in qualitative and quantitative research of local promising practices.
- Utilize available data sets to measure impact of programming.
