

Example 4:

Boyfriend (age 16) - Girlfriend (age 16)

\ /
their daughter (age 2)

AEITL RESULTS: The system cannot determine which of the parents is the minor head of household for time limit purposes because there are two unmarried parents; therefore AEITL will display both of the parents. The “T/L” field will be blank for both of them. Following a discussion with the assistance group, the worker must designate one of the unmarried parents on AEITL, by entering a “Y” in the “T/L” field for the individual who was chosen by the assistance group as the [minor] head of household for time limits.

Example 5:

Man (age 59) - married to - Woman (age 58)

\ /
their daughter (age 14) and her boyfriend (age 20)

\ /
their son (age 1)

AEITL RESULTS: The system will determine that the married couple are the countable individuals in the AG as the head of household and spouse of the head of household; therefore AEITL will display a “Y” in the “T/L” field for them, and the “Audit” field will display “S” (for system determined). The younger parents are not married; the minor parent does not meet the statutory definition of minor head of household, and her boyfriend is neither a minor, nor the head of household; so neither is a countable individual for time limits.


Example 6:

Man (age 20) - married to - Woman (age 16)

\ /
their son (age 1)

AEITL RESULTS: The system will determine that the married couple are the countable individuals in the AG, as the head of household and the spouse of the head of household; therefore AEITL will display a “Y” in the “T/L” field for each of them, and the “Audit” field will display “S” (for system determined.)


Example 7:



AEITL RESULTS: The system will determine the married couple are the countable individuals in the AG, as the head of household and spouse of the head of household; therefore AEITL will display a “Y” in the “T/L” field for each of them, and the “Audit” field will display “S” (for system determined).

None of the younger parents are married; none of the minor parents meet the statutory definition of minor head of household; so none of the younger parents are countable individuals for time limits

Example 8:



AEITL RESULTS: AEITL will not be included in the driver or displayed for this assistance group because there is no adult head of household for time limit counting purposes. The adult mother is a recipient of SSI, so the assistance group only contains the children. As a result, the OWF time limits are not applicable to this assistance group.
