

Medicaid Managed Care Request for Applications: **2012** Summary of Amendments

The Ohio Medicaid Managed Care Request for Applications (RFA) has been amended in the following ways:

- Main Text:
 - On page 36, IV. E. “Application Selection” has been revised. The previous selection methodology posed an unintended consequence which is the possibility that the fourth highest scoring Applicant could lose to a lower scoring Applicant during Stage 2 of the selection process, thereby eliminating a higher performing Applicant. Therefore, the selection methodology has been changed so that the four highest scoring applications within each region will be selected to receive tentative awards.
 - The due date for Letters of Intent has been changed from 3pm February 27, 2012 to 3pm March 2, 2012 throughout the main text.
- Appendix B:
 - On page 12, in 5 a., the scoring sheet instructions have been updated to clarify that CY 2011 data should be reported for Item 9.
 - Exhibit B-3: a fourteenth scenario was added to the scenario possibilities.
- Appendix C:
 - The numbering has been corrected on page 1 of under the heading “Instructions for Completion of Appendix C”.
 - The benchmarks for measure #10, Comprehensive Diabetes Care: HbA1c Poor Control (>9.0%), in the Appendix C Scoring Key have been corrected.
 - The label for measure #11 on the Appendix C Scoring Key has been corrected to be consistent with measure #11 on page 2 of Appendix C.
- Appendix D:
 - Question 3 on page 8 has been revised so that Applicants may report experience for a complex/high risk care management program if the Applicant has a minimum staffing ratio of 1 full time equivalent for every 200 beneficiaries (1FTE: 200 beneficiaries).
 - Dates were specified in the table of question 3 on page 8.
 - On question 6.b. on page 16, the example calculation of average number of beneficiaries in CY 2011 table was updated.
- Appendix E:
 - The term “Other” has been replaced by the term “Rural” in Exhibit E-2, in each of the regional panel summaries.
