

E. PLANS/HEARINGS/REVIEWS/PERIODIC REVIEWS AND COURT ACTIVITIES

The Client Events in this section reflect any of a series of Case Plans, administrative reviews, visits, regular exams, or other evaluations which are designed to ensure that all efforts are being directed towards the best interest of the child. In addition, these Events are also used to report any Court Activities (Court Reviews and Hearings) which occur for children under Court Ordered Protective Supervision and for children in the custody of the Agency who reside in substitute care. These activities **must** occur on a regularly scheduled basis for children in custody who reside in substitute care, for clients under a Court Ordered Protective Supervision, as well as for other children who require these types of activity.

EVENT 150: CUSTODY COMPLAINT FILED

Purpose: This Client Event documents there is a motion before the court which has been initiated alleging abuse, neglect, dependency, delinquency or unruly behavior and requests Agency custody as a resolution/disposition.

Usage: This Client Event is entered upon the Agency's filing of a complaint which includes a request for some type of Agency custody. This event is also entered when the court awards the Agency custody of a child without the Agency petitioning for custody.

Event Date: The event date is the date the Agency files the complaint with the court.

Elements: Not Applicable.

Connectedness: None.

EVENT 152: SHELTER CARE HEARING HELD

Purpose: This Client Event documents the completion of the court hearing that is required to document the need for removal and justification for substitute care for any child placed in substitute care on an emergency basis. The hearing is required to take place before the end of the next business day or no later than seventy-two (72) hours after an emergency placement is made.

Usage: This Client Event is entered to reflect the date of the hearing following an emergency placement of a child into Agency substitute

care.

Event Date: The event date is the date the hearing was held.

Elements: Not Applicable.

Connectedness: None.

EVENT 154: BEST INTEREST STATEMENT

Purpose: This Client Event documents there is court documentation in the Agency's record that addresses the court's determination that the child's best interest is being met by placement into substitute care.

Usage: This Client Event is entered when the court issues the statement that the placement of a child into substitute care is in the child's best interest. The Best Interest Statement will be a part of a court document (i.e., pre dispositional order in a shelter care hearing).

Event Date: The event date is the date of the court hearing in which the court made the determination.

Elements: Not Applicable.

Connectedness: None.

EVENT 142: JUDICIAL DETERMINATION REASONABLE EFFORTS REQUIRED

Purpose: This Client Event documents that the Agency has received a Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts to Prevent Placement or a Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts to Finalize the Permanency Plan.

Note: This event and Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required make Event 156: Reasonable Efforts Statement Received obsolete, effective 2/16/2001.

Usage: **Initial Reasonable Efforts** - Initial Reasonable Efforts (value 01-Reasonable Efforts to Prevent Placement) are required to be made within 60 days of the event date of Event 080: Initial Custody or within 60 days of the Event 082: Change in Custody if in Event 080 the values of 01- Officer Acceptance or 07-Agency Authority have been used. (The values 01 and 07 do not reflect a Judicial Determination).

If the event date of Event 142: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Required (value 01-Reasonable Efforts to Prevent Placement) or of Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required is not within 60 days of the event date of Event 080: Initial Custody (for any value other than 01 or 07,) the child will **not** be program eligible or reimbursable for Title IV-E benefits for the current foster care episode.

If the event date of Event 142: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Required (value 01-Reasonable Efforts to Prevent Placement) or of Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required is not within 60 days of the event date of Event 082: Change in Custody (when an Event 082 follows an Event 080 with a value of 01 or 07,) the child will **not** be program eligible or reimbursable for Title IV-E benefits for the current foster care episode.

First Annual Judicial Determination - The first annual Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts to Finalize the Permanency Plan is required within 12 months of the federal start date. For children in the custody of the Agency through a judicial order, the federal start date is defined as the earlier of the following dates: 1) the date which is 60 days after the date of the Judicial Determination granting Initial Custody of the child; or 2) the date that the court first issued an Adjudicatory Order of abuse, neglect or a dependency. For children in the custody of an Agency through a Voluntary Agreement, the federal start date is the date that the child was physically removed from the home and placed in substitute care.

Subsequent Judicial Determinations - All subsequent Judicial Determinations of Reasonable Efforts to Finalize the Permanency Plan should be received within 12 months of the previous Judicial Determination. Every Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts to Finalize the Permanency Plan sets the 12 month clock for the next Judicial Determination to be made. If a Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts Not Required has been entered outside of the 60 day window for documenting the Initial Reasonable Efforts, the Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required will be counted as an annual review of Reasonable Efforts. The next Judicial Determination will be due 12 months from the Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required.

Event Date: The event date is the date the Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts occurred.

Elements: Elements for Event 142: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Required are (1) Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts

Required and (2) Judicial Determination Date.

EVENT 144: JUDICIAL DETERMINATION REASONABLE EFFORTS NOT REQUIRED

Purpose: This Client Event documents that the Agency has received a Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts Not Required as the initial statement of Reasonable Efforts. This event also documents a Judicial Determination at a later time Reasonable Efforts were no longer required. This event additionally documents the reason(s) why Reasonable Efforts were not required.

Note: Event 142: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Required and this event make Event 156: Reasonable Efforts Statement Received obsolete, effective 2/16/2001.

Usage: If there has been a Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts Not Required, this event must be entered within 60 days of the event date of Event 080: Initial Custody or within 60 days of the Event 082: Change in Custody if in Event 080 the values of 01-Officer Acceptance or 07-Agency Authority have been used. (The values 01 and 07 do not reflect a Judicial Determination)

If the event date of Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required or of Event 142: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Required (value 01-Reasonable Efforts to Prevent Placement) is not within 60 days of the event date of Event 080: Initial Custody (for any value other than 01 or 07,) the child will **not** be program eligible or reimbursable for Title IV-E benefits for the current foster care episode.

If the event date of Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required or of Event 142: Judicial Determination

Reasonable Efforts Required (value 01-Reasonable Efforts to Prevent Placement) is not within 60 days of the event date of Event 082: Change in Custody (when an Event 082 follows an Event 080 with a value of 01 or 07,) the child will **not** be program eligible or reimbursable for Title IV-E benefits for the current foster care episode.

This event is also entered any time the court makes a Judicial Determination that Reasonable Efforts are Not Required during the life of the case.

Event Date: The event date is the date of the Judicial Determination that Reasonable Efforts were not required.

Elements: Elements for Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required are (1-5) Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required, and (6) Judicial Determination Date.

1-5. Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required: This Element may be used five (5) times. If less than five reasons have been selected, enter value 97 - Not Applicable to assure that each of the five elements has a value.

EVENT 182: REASONABLE EFFORTS NOT REQUIRED PERMANENCY HEARING RESULTS

Purpose: This Client Event documents the date which the Court approved the Agency's Permanency Plan for the child in any case where there

has been a Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts Not Required. This Client Event allows the Agency to document the dates of the incremental steps necessary for the final approval of the Permanency Plan.

Usage: When Reasonable Efforts are not required, there must be a Permanency Hearing within 30 days of the Judicial Determination date entered in Event 144: Judicial Determination Reasonable Efforts Not Required. The court may make a determination at any time during the life of a case that Reasonable Efforts are not required. When the court makes the Judicial Determination of Reasonable Efforts Not Required, this event should be entered.

Event Date: The event date is the date the hearing occurs (the Judicial Determination date of the Permanency Hearing).

Elements: Elements for Event 182: Permanency Plan Hearing Results are (1) Permanency Plan, (2) Filing Date, (3) Date of Hearing and (4) Judicial Determination Date.

EVENT 158: PETITION FOR PROTECTIVE SUPERVISION

- Purpose:** This Client Event documents there has been a motion filed with the court which permits an abused, neglected, dependent, delinquent or unruly child to remain in the home in the custody of the parent, guardian, or custodian.
- Usage:** This Client Event is entered to reflect the date of a filing of a complaint which includes a request by the Agency for Court Ordered Protective Supervision. In addition, this event is also entered when the court awards the Agency Protective Supervision of a child without the Agency petitioning for it. In addition, the child, parent, guardian, or custodian and other household members may be ordered by the court to comply with the specific conditions and limitations to ensure the protection of the child while in the home.
- Event Date:** The event date is the date of the court hearing.
- Elements:** Not Applicable.
- Connectedness:** None.

EVENT 162: ADJUDICATION HEARING HELD

- Purpose:** This Client Event documents a court hearing has been held for a child for whom a complaint/petition has been filed alleging abuse, neglect, dependency, delinquency or unruly conduct and which issues a judicial finding on the complaint.
- Usage:** This Client Event is entered to reflect the court's determination on an Agency's complaint which requests custody or Court Ordered Protective Supervision of a child. **If value 01- Dismissed is used, Event 164: Dispositional Hearing Held must be entered with a value 01-Dismissed even though you did not actually have the hearing.**
- Event date:** The event date is the date of the court hearing.
- Elements:** Element for Event 162: Adjudication Hearing Held is (1) Results.
1. Results: Judicial finding regarding the child that is issued at the adjudicatory hearing. This is found in the journal entry.
Values for Results:

EVENT 170: ADDITIONAL ADJUDICATION

Purpose: This Client Event documents multiple determinations by the court and identifies additional adjudications by the court not requested by the Agency's complaint filed.

Usage: This Client Event is entered after the Event 162: Adjudication Hearing Held to reflect additional adjudications by the court. **If value 01-Dismissed is entered for Event 162: Adjudication Hearing Held, do not enter Event 170: Additional Adjudication.**

Event Date: The event date is the date of the court hearing which will be the same date as Event 162: Adjudication Hearing Held.

Elements: Element for Event 170: Additional Adjudication is (1) Results.

1. **Results:** Additional judicial findings regarding the child that are issued at the adjudicatory hearing. This is found in the journal entry.

EVENT 164: DISPOSITIONAL HEARING HELD

Purpose: This Client Event documents the Juvenile Court's disposition of an adjudication, motion or annual court review requirement.

Usage: This Client Event is used to track the court's disposition of all adjudicated children, modifications of existing court orders and the outcome of all court review hearings, including the Annual Court Review Hearing.

This Client Event further reflects results of the initial case disposition following the adjudication hearing and any subsequent disposition issued by the court on motions filed by participants in the case.

This Client Event can be entered multiple times if the Dispositional Hearing has more than one outcome. (i.e. If the hearing is also the Annual Court Review Hearing, the event is entered twice using appropriate values for each entry.)

This Client Event **is entered regardless** if the result from the hearing is the same as reported in a previous Dispositional Hearing.

Event Date: The event date is the date of the hearing.

Elements: Element for Event 164: Dispositional Hearing Held is (1) Results.

EVENT 166: SUNSET MOTION FILED

Purpose: This Client Event documents a motion was filed by the Agency with the court seeking an extension or modification of an order of temporary custody or Court Ordered Protective Supervision.

Usage: This Client Event tracks the date the Agency files for an extension or modification of a temporary custody order or Court Ordered Protective Supervision, and also tracks the disposition being requested by the Agency.

Event Date: The event date is the date the Agency files the motion with the court.

Elements: Element for Event 166: Sunset Motion Filed is (1) Disposition Requested.

1. Disposition Requested: The type of disposition requested by the Agency of an existing order of temporary custody or Court Ordered Protective Supervision.

EVENT 160: EXTENDED PROTECTIVE SUPERVISION ORDER

Purpose: This Client Event documents an order was issued by the Juvenile Court which extends a Court Ordered Protective Supervision by an Agency for a specified period of time.

Usage: This Client Event reflects each time the court extends an existing Court Ordered Protective Supervision. It will also identify the expiration date of the extension of Court Ordered Protective Supervision.

Event Date: The event date is the date the court issues the order to extend the Court Ordered Protective Supervision.

Elements: Element for Event 160: Extended Protective Supervision Order is (1) Expiration Date.

1. Expiration Date: The date specified in the court's journal entry that the Court Ordered Protective Supervision terminates.

EVENT 168: CUSTODY EXTENSION - TEMPORARY CUSTODY

Purpose: This Client Event documents an order from the Juvenile Court was issued and continues the temporary custody of a child with an Agency for a specified period of time not to exceed six (6) months.

Usage: This Client Event reflects each time the court extends an existing order of temporary custody. It will also identify the expiration date of the extension of temporary custody.

Event Date: The event date is the date the court issues the order to extend the custody order.

Elements: Element for Event 168: Custody Extension - Temporary Custody is (1) Expiration Date.

1. Expiration Date: The date specified in the court's journal entry that the Temporary Custody Extension terminates.

EVENT 244: RESULTS OF 12 OUT OF 22 MONTHS PERMANENCY DECISION

Purpose: This Client Event documents the Agency's decision to file or not to file for Termination of Parental Rights (TPR) for the child, when the child has been in custody for 12 months (or a total of 365 days) out of the last 22 months. A review of the child's permanency plan is required prior to the 366th day of substitute care during the last 22 months.

Usage: This event reports the Agency's intentions to file or not to file for TPR for the child based upon the 12 out of 22 months review of the child's Case Plan in accordance with Ohio law.

If known by the Agency, time which the child spent in substitute care from previous foster care episodes and time in substitute care while a resident of another county or state are considered in the calculation of the 365 day count.

Trial home visits and AWOL episodes' days do not count toward the calculation of the 365 days, but are counted when calculating the 22 month time frame.

Event Date: The event date is the date that the Agency makes the 12 out of 22 months decision.

Elements: Elements for Event 244: Results of 12 Out of 22 Months Permanency Decision are (1) 12 out of 22 Month Decision, (2) Previous Episode or County and (3) Date of 12/22 Decision.

Purpose: This Client Event documents the date and the reason(s) the Agency filed a motion with the court to terminate the mother's parental rights.

Usage: This event is entered when a motion is filed by the Agency to terminate the mother's parental rights. If the mother's parental rights were already terminated or if the mother is deceased, this event would not be entered.

Event Date: The event date is the date the Agency's motion for TPR was file stamped with the court.

Elements: Elements for Event 246: Motion Filed to Terminate Mother's Parental Rights are (1) File Stamp Date and (2-6) Reason Termination of Parental Rights Filed.

1. File Stamp Date: Date the Agency's motion for TPR was file stamped with the court.

Purpose: This Client Event documents the date the court terminated the mother's parental rights.

Usage: This Client Event is entered to capture the date the court terminated the mother's parental rights. If the mother of the child has not had her parental rights terminated, do not complete this event. If mother's parental rights were terminated prior to Agency's involvement, this event **must** be entered. If the mother is known to be deceased, enter the date of death as the date the parental rights were terminated.

Event Date: The event date is the date of the Journal Entry file stamp terminating mother's parental rights.

Elements: Element for Event 266: Date of Mother's Termination of Parental Rights is (1) Date of Mother's TPR.

EVENT 248: MOTION FILED TO TERMINATE FATHER'S PARENTAL RIGHTS

Purpose: This Client Event identifies the date and the reason(s) the Agency filed a motion with the court to terminate the father's parental rights.

Usage: This event is entered when a motion is filed by the Agency to terminate the father's parental rights. If the father's parental rights were already terminated or if the father is deceased, this event would not be entered.

Event Date: The event date is the date the Agency's motion for TPR was file stamped with the court.

Elements: Elements for Event 248: Motion Filed to Terminate Father's Parental Rights are (1) File Stamp Date and (2-6) Reason Termination of Parental Rights Filed.

1. File Stamp Date: Date the Agency's motion for TPR was file stamped with the court.

EVENT 268: DATE OF FATHER'S TERMINATION OF PARENTAL RIGHTS (TPR)

- Purpose:** This Client Event documents the date the court terminated the father's parental rights.
- Usage:** This Client Event is entered to capture the date the court terminated the father's parental rights. If the father of the child has not had his parental rights terminated, do not complete this event. If father's parental rights were terminated prior to Agency's involvement, this event **must** be entered. If the father is known to be deceased, enter the date of death as the date the parental rights were terminated.
- Event Date:** The event date is the date of the Journal Entry file stamp terminating father's parental rights.
- Elements:** Element for Event 268: Date of Father's Termination of Parental Rights is (1) Date of Father's TPR.
1. Date of Father's TPR: The date the father's parental rights were terminated.

EVENT 220: CASE PLAN COMPLETED

- Purpose:** This Client Event documents the completion of all required Case Plan elements by the Agency and the existence of the supervisor's signature on the Case Plan document (ODJFS 01444) after the decision to provide ongoing services to a child and family and/or the decision to place the child in substitute care having either: filed a complaint alleging that the child is an abused, neglected or dependent; been granted temporary or permanent custody of the child; or been granted a court order for Permanent Planned Living Arrangement.
- Usage:** This Client Event is entered at the time the Case Plan is completed.
- This Client Event must be updated as appropriate when Case Plan amendments (Event 222: Amendment to Case Plan) affect placement changes or the client's Case Plan goal changes.**
- Event Date:** The event date is the date the supervisor signs the Case Plan document or amendment.

Elements: Elements for Event 220: Case Plan Completed are (1) Child's Goal, (2) Party Participate, (3) Least Restrictive, (4) Cultural Heritage, (5) Close Proximity to Family and (6) Close Proximity to School.

1. Child's Goal: The goal of services identified by the Agency at the time the Case Plan is completed or amended.

4. Cultural Heritage: **Federal law prohibits the routine consideration of race or culture for placement purposes.** The reference to Cultural Heritage was removed from the ODJFS 01444 "Case Plan"; therefore, only value 97: Not Applicable may be entered for this Element.
