Both the administrative and program portions are included in the above allocation amounts for both the Program Year (PY) and Fiscal Year (FY) distributions issued to the local area within each program year.

Local boards may have used alternative methods to increase or decrease a given county's WIA funding and/or may have permitted transfers of funds between counties within the area, so in some cases, the formula-based allocations listed here may not match a county's actual funding received from its local area.
