Subject GOVERNOR TAFT TO DESIGNATE STARK COUNTY UNDER A REGIONAL COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENT AS A WORKFORCE INVESTMENT AREA UNDER THE WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT OF 1998

Commissioner Jackson moved for the adoption of the following resolution which was seconded by Commissioner Watkins:

WHEREAS, the comprehensive reform legislation, the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 supersedes the Job Training Partnership Act and amends the Wagner-Peyser Act; and,

WHEREAS, the County of Stark, along with the Counties of Tuscarawas, Carroll, Holmes and Wayne, have comprised by agreement a regional council of Government and an Ohio Service Delivery Area known as SDA #23, under and in compliance with, the Job Training Partnership Act; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Stark County Commissioners as the Board of Local Elected officials under Regional Council of Government for SDA #23 has served as grant recipient for employment and training and other related funds with no disallowed costs for each of the past seventeen years; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Stark County Commissioners as the Board of Local Elected Officials under the Regional Council of Government for SDA #23 has operated successful employment and training systems and programs, meeting and exceeding U.S. Department of Labor performance standards for each of the past seventeen years under the Job Training Partnership Act; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Stark County Commissioners has worked successfully within its public/private partnership with the Board of Local Elected Officials-appointed Private Industry Council which includes representation from business, labor, educational institutions and others to provide local workforce development policy and quality management of such programs; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Stark county Commissioners intends to further expand its workforce development responsibilities as outlined both explicitly and implicitly in the Workforce Investment Act of 1998.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Stark County Commissioners choosing the Workforce Investment Act option under the Regional Council of Government hereby requests designation from the Governor as a Workforce Investment Area for the purpose of implementing a comprehensive workforce development system.

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RESOLUTION (691-99) WORKFORCE INVESTMENT AREA

It was moved by Commissioner Pancher, seconded by Commissioner Carlisle, to approve the following as recommended by Commissioner Smith, the liason for the Board:

Requesting Governor Robert Taft to designate Tuscarawas County under a Regional Council of Government as a Workforce Investment Area under the Workforce Investment Act of 1998.

WHEREAS, the comprehensive reform legislation, the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 supersedes the Job Training Partnership Act and amends the Wagner-Peyser Act; and,

WHEREAS, the County of Tuscarawas, along with the Counties of Stark, Carroll, Holmes and Wayne, have comprised by agreement a Regional Council of Government and an Ohio Service Delivery Area known as SDA #23, under, and in compliance with, the Job Training Partnership Act; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners as the Board of Local Elected Officials under the Regional Council of Government for SDA #23 has served as grant recipient for employment and training and other related funds with no disallowed costs for each of the past seventeen years; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners as the Board of Local Elected Officials under the Regional Council of Government for SDA #23 has operated successful employment and training systems and programs, meeting and exceeding U.S. Department of Labor performance standards for each of the past seventeen years under the Job Training Partnership Act; and,



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WHEREAS, the Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners has worked successfully within its public/private partnership with the Board of Local Elected Officials-appointed Private Industry Council which includes representation from business, labor, educational institutions and others to provide local workforce development policy and quality management of such programs;

AND WHEREAS, the Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners intends to further expand its workforce development responsibilities as outlined both explicitly and implicitly in the Workforce Investment Act of 1998.
