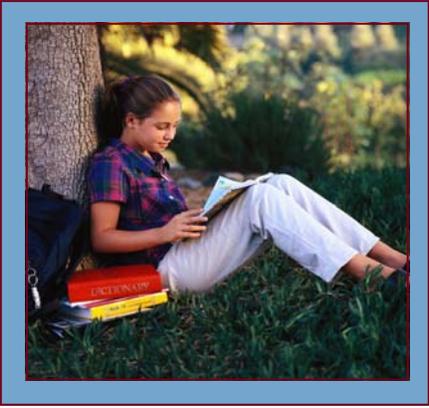

Statewide Evaluation Activities



Gold Standard One-Stop Certification and Continuous Improvement Program

Background

In PY 2007, Ohio implemented the Gold Standard One-Stop Certification and Continuous Improvement Program. The program examines the quality and delivery of business and job seeker services, accessibility and effectiveness of services, and the continuous improvement efforts of Ohio's 30 full-service, local One-Stop Systems.

As part of the One-Stop continuous improvement process, state and local stakeholders developed the Gold Standard Balanced Scorecard, which focuses on 12 benchmarks of performance excellence and 32 Critical Success Factors (CSFs). The CSFs are standards of performance that were identified as being critical to ensuring program and service accountability for One-Stops.

Results

To prepare for the issuance of a Gold Standard Balanced Scorecard for each One-Stop System, the Office of Workforce Development, Technical Assistance Unit, gathered CFS data between January 1, 2008 and September 2009 using five data collection methods: Business Surveys (574 received), Partner Assessments (796 received in the first phase), Mystery Shopping (over 200 Mystery Shops completed), On-Site Observations (all 90 facilities reviewed and all 31 Level 2 sites' customer work flows completed), and Desk Reviews. The data was analyzed and each of the 30 One-Stop Systems was scored from 0 (not compliant) to 4 points (exemplary) on the CSFs, assigned a Level of Excellence (see scoring scale below), and given their preliminary results.

Balanced Scorecards were generated and meetings were held with each area to discuss noted strengths and challenges, explore technical assistance needs, present best practices, benchmark results from other systems, and gather further documentation and input related to the scoring. Noted innovative practices included extended hours at One-Stop centers, satellite and access point locations, common assessment processes, and online case management systems.

Preliminary Gold Standard Balanced Scorecard results show that 16 of Ohio's 30 One-Stop Systems have achieved the White Level of Excellence, 12 have achieved the Bronze Level, and 2 have achieved the Silver Level. None of Ohio's 30 One-Stop Systems are performing below expectations.

General One-Stop Observations

- Statewide, job seekers have access to helpful core services in One-Stops.
- Partners have achieved co-location and some level of efficiency through collaboration.
- Some WIBs have implemented oversight methods, regional projects, and other promising practices.
- Private sector WIB members must accept a greater leadership role to ensure a demand-driven system.
- Further efforts to engage and collaboratively serve businesses are needed along with further research to ascertain business awareness and satisfaction with the One-Stop System.
- Although partner funding to support the One-Stops is shrinking, few One-Stops have attempted fee-based services or found significant alternative funding.

Next Steps

- The Partner Assessment was repeated earlier this year and the data is being compiled. Reports for each local area will be issued in PY 2009.
- A new On-Line Business Survey is scheduled to be released to Ohio's business community in PY 2009.
- Data from Mystery Shopping, Desk Reviews, and On-Site Observations with an emphasis on local business team collaboration will continue to be gathered for the remainder of the Gold Standard Program.

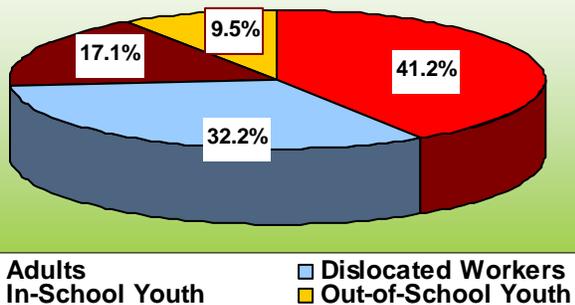

| 1. Waiver to permit the state to replace the statutory performance measures at WIA Section 136 (b) with the common measures | Allows the state to report only on the common measures, simplifies the reporting system, and directly improves overall performance outcomes. |
| 2. Waiver to permit Ohio to use up to 20 percent of local area adult and dislocated worker funds to provide statewide activities identified at WIA Section 134(a)(3) including incumbent worker training | Provides broader flexibility for local areas to engage and work with businesses by improving the skills of their employers' workforce. Allows local areas to assist employers to avert layoffs and help workers to improve skills, increase earnings, and retain employment. |
| 3. Waiver of the recapture and reallocation provisions of WIA sections 128(c), 133(c), and 20 CFR 667.160 | Provides the state with greater flexibility to recapture and reallocate funds and allows for increased efficiency and effectiveness in the management of federal funds. Permits Ohio to: recapture mid-year deobligation and reallocation of local area funds; recapture funds from local areas that have not expended at least 80 percent of their local funds in the first year; use recaptured funds for statewide activities or reallocation to other eligible workforce area; and use an additional factor in determining local area eligibility for reallocation of recaptured funds including demonstrated need and ability to use additional funds. |

Program Year 2008 Participation Summary

In PY 2008, Ohio served 45,903 WIA participants; placed 8,112 adults and dislocated workers into jobs; placed 2,048 youth into jobs or education; and assisted 2,009 youth to obtain recognized certificates and diplomas. Ohio served 4,344 out-of-school youth and 7,876 in-school youth.

Overall, the state provided 131,195 core, intensive, and training services to WIA participants. Of these services, 23,163 participants received training services. Ohio also provided assistance to 292,176 self-service only customers through the One-Stop System.

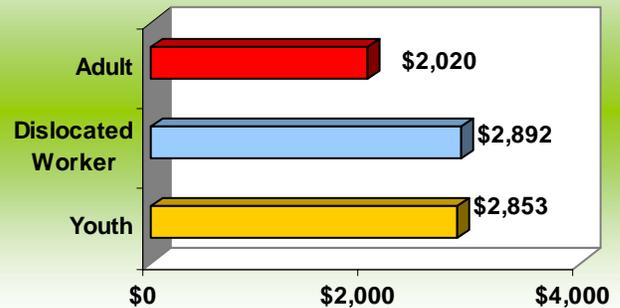
Figure 1: PY 2008 Participants Served (Shown as a Percentage)



The Adult Program served the highest number of participants with 18,918. The Dislocated Worker Program served 14,765 (5,537 more than in the previous year - a 37.5 increase) and the Youth Program served 12,220 WIA customers (also up from PY 2007). These program numbers are shown as percentages in Figure 1. As in PYs 2006 and 2007, all three programs had an increase in participation.

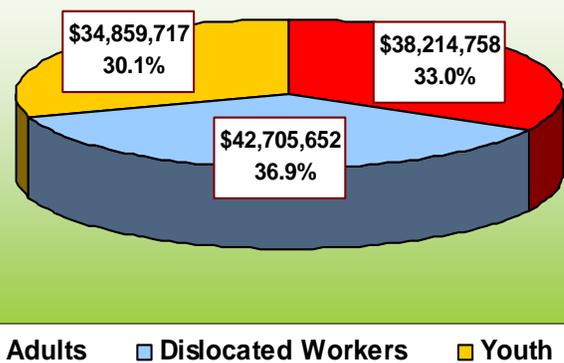
Figure 2: PY 2008 Cost Per WIA Participant

This year, the average cost per participant (calculated by dividing the total adult, dislocated worker, and youth program expenditures by the number of individuals served) was \$2,522. As shown in Figure 2, Ohio expended an average of \$2,020 per adult, \$2,892 per dislocated worker, and \$2,853 per youth.

In PY 2008, Ohio spent nearly \$116 million in WIA funds on adult, dislocated worker, and youth program activities. This amount does not include obligations.

For the first time since WIA inception, Ohio's Dislocated Worker Program incurred the largest portion of expenditures (see Figure 3). The Dislocated Worker Program expended approximately \$42.7 million, the Adult Program expended \$38.2 million, and the Youth Program expended \$34.9 million.

WIA Statewide Performance

Ohio's PY 2008 WIA Annual Report includes statewide performance on individuals who finished their participation in WIA ("exited") in PY 2008 (July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009). The report contains information on participants served, services provided, and the outcomes obtained by participants.

For PY 2008, Ohio is pleased to report that the state met or exceeded all nine negotiated performance levels for common measures. Figure 4 presents a summary of Ohio's performance.

Program Year 2008 Cost Effectiveness

In PY 2008, Ohio served 45,903 participants (up from 39,989 the year before) at an average cost per participant of \$2,522. This cost efficiency measure is calculated by taking the total program expenditures divided by the total number of participants served during PY 2008. As shown below, the state expended \$115,780,127 on core, intensive, and training services for the three WIA population groups.

Of the participants served, 23,163 (50.5 percent) received training services. When compared to PY 2007, this represents a 17.5 percent increase in participants

who received training services. The number of dislocated workers enrolled and who received training services also significantly increased from 4,446 in PY 2007 to 7,443 in PY 2008 (a 40.3 percent increase).

For the year, Ohio expended an average cost of \$2,020 per adult, \$2,892 per dislocated worker, and \$2,853 per youth participant. This WIA investment does not reflect the substantial returns to the state that result from earnings, public assistance and unemployment insurance savings, and increased tax revenue from exiters who enter employment.
