

# **PRC PLAN REVISIONS EFFECTIVE 08-15-11**

The PRC plan dated 7-1-11 has been revised and includes the following changes:

## **PRC PLAN REVISIONS EFFECTIVE 08-15-2011**

**Chapter 3- the following language was added** “to prevent placement in agency custody” in the chapter overview. The following services were added: car repair, car insurance and school clothing.

**Chapter 9- removed language pertaining to the TANF ARRA summer youth program.** Language was added to add a program for food assistance eligible customers. The program offers a Wal-Mart gift card to June 2011 food assistance households where one adult household member was working 20 hours per week at minimum wage or who were employed at least 20 hours per week at federal minimum wage multiplied by 20 hours per week and earning at least \$592 during the month of June 2011.

Added the following language under “Residence”: Households who received food assistance in June 2011 from Sandusky County and are not residents of Sandusky County now will not be eligible for this program.

Under “Income” added the following language- “The PRC assistance group must have met the income guidelines to have been in receipt of food assistance during June 2011”.

Under “Scope of Services” added that services include a Wal-Mart gift card to purchase household needs excluding alcohol and tobacco products.

All purchases must be made by October 31, 2011. Gift cards will be surrendered at the time of purchase and any remaining balance(s) will be forfeited and returned to the Sandusky County Department of Job and Family Services.

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## **SANDUSKY COUNTY PREVENTION, RETENTION, CONTINGENCY PLAN AMENDED effective 08-15-2011**

### **Overview**

The Prevention, Retention, and Contingency (PRC) Program is designed to provide benefits and Services to eligible households with at least one minor child to overcome barriers to achieving or maintaining self-sufficiency and personal responsibility. These supports include non-recurrent, short-term, crisis-oriented benefits and ongoing services that are directly related to the four purposes of the TANF program, which do not meet the federal definition of assistance.

Eligibility factors, time restraints, and amount available to pay for the various benefits and services covered must be explained. Anyone applying for PRC services must receive appropriate information about, referrals to, and access to Medicaid, food stamps, Ohio Works First (OWF), childcare assistance and other programs that provide benefits that could help them successfully transition to work. The voter registration application as prescribed by the secretary of state under section 3503.10 of the ORC will be made available to persons who are applying for, receiving assistance from or participating in the PRC program. Reference Section 329.051 of the ORC.

Services and benefits shall be provided which directly lead to or can be expected to lead the family in becoming self-sufficient by accomplishing one of the four purposes of TANF:

- a. Providing assistance to needy families;
- b. Ending the dependence of needy parents by promoting job preparation, work and marriage;
- c. Preventing and reducing out-of-wedlock pregnancies; and
- d. Encouraging the formation and maintenance of two-parent families.

PRC assistance will be available to the extent of availability of state and federal funds.

All PRC assistance groups' records will be recorded in CRISE and supporting documentation will be found in On-Base.

### **Eligibility Requirements**

There are certain eligibility requirements that must be met in order to determine eligibility for the PRC program. The following sections explain the requirements and procedures that must be followed when making an eligibility determination.

These sections are applicable to all of the benefits and services covered under the SCDJFS PRC Program unless specified differently within the explanation of the particular benefit/service.

Social security numbers will be used to check information provided by the AG against information held by other federal, state, and local governments; computer matching systems; and program reviews or audits to ensure eligibility for PRC.

### **Assistance Group Composition**

The PRC Program is designed to meet the needs of households with minor children. A minor child is defined as a child who has not attained age nineteen and is a full-time student in a secondary school or in the equivalent level of vocational or technical training. An eligible child must be living in the home of a specified relative (as defined in H.B. 408), legal guardian, or legal custodian. For purposes of the PRC Program, an assistance group consists of all eligible children and the specified relative(s), legal guardian, or legal custodian.

A child may be “temporarily absent” from the home in accordance with the time frames established in rule 5101: 1-3-04 of the Ohio Administrative Code and still qualify for PRC. During the temporary period, the child is considered to be residing with the parent, caretaker relative, legal guardian or legal custodian and other members of the household (who may or may not be related to the minor child) who may significantly enhance the family’s ability to achieve economic self-sufficiency.

### **Citizenship**

In order to qualify for PRC, assistance group members must meet the citizenship requirements as determined by the current OWF (Ohio Works First) program requirements. In order to issue PRC, at least one adult and at least one eligible child must meet the above citizenship requirements.

### **Residence**

Residence in Sandusky County is a requirement. Residence is established by living in the county voluntarily with the intent to remain permanently or for an indefinite period of time. Residence is also established by a person who is not receiving assistance from another state and entered the county with a job commitment or is seeking employment, whether or not currently employed. A child is a resident of the county in which the caretaker is a resident.

### **Income**

Eligibility for PRC is dependent upon the AG’s demonstration and verification of need for financial assistance and/or services. In order for eligibility to be determined, the income of the AG must be compared to the economic need standard established for the benefits and services requested. The economic need standards are based upon federal poverty guideline measures, which shall be updated annually, generally in March, when the federal poverty guidelines are released.

The only income that will be excluded will be as listed in OAC 5101:1-24-20.

All income, which is received or expected to be received during the 30 day budget period, is considered when determining financial need. The budget period begins 30 days from the date of the PRC application unless this period of time does not accurately reflect expected income. In this instance, income received 30 days prior to the date of application may be utilized. The total gross income, both earned and unearned, of all the PRC AG members, must be counted. The only exclusion allowed is for self-employment expenses, which shall be deducted from the total profit of the self-employment enterprise. The gross amount of the PRC AG’s countable income is totaled and compared to the county’s PRC standard for the benefits or services requested for the appropriate PRC AG size. If the total PRC AG income is equal to or less than the standard for the applicable PRC AG size, the PRC AG meets the income requirement. If any member of the assistance group is an OWF recipient, the assistance group will automatically be considered income eligible.

Written or verbal verification of income is required. For any verification, which is obtained by telephone, there must be clear documentation in the PRC AG record concerning the name and position of the supplier of the information, the date the verification was obtained, the amount of the verified income, and the name of the individual who obtained the verification.

### **Disqualified Assistance Groups**

**There are certain assistance groups who are ineligible to receive PRC. If any one member of the PRC AG meets one of the following disqualifications, the entire AG is ineligible to receive PRC. They include fugitive felons and/or families that fraudulently receive under the OWF and PRC programs until repayment occurs. All PRC overpayments shall be subject to the same rules and regulations as TANF overpayments as outlined in the OAC section 5101:1-23-70. Following the rules of TANF-OWF, any applicants that falsify their application or documents related to their eligibility for PRC, will be referred to the Benefit Recovery Unit of the agency. Persons referred for fraud, will not be eligible for PRC until their case is resolved with the Fraud Unit.**

### **Applicant Responsibility**

An applicant for PRC is responsible for completing all necessary documents, furnishing all available facts and information, and cooperating in the eligibility determination process. The applicant also must cooperate with exploring available community resources.

### **Application Process**

The "Prevention, Retention, and Contingency" application form has been developed for use when an assistance group is applying for PRC services. This application form will be used unless it is specified differently under the explanation of the particular benefit/service.

### **Standard of Promptness**

Eligibility will be carefully determined on a case-by-case basis. Upon receipt of a completed PRC application, the county will make an eligibility determination within 10 business days. The ten-day standard of promptness is a suggested time frame that is intended to stress the importance of dealing with PRC applications in an appropriately efficient manner. In situations in which the need presented by the applicant requires an earlier decision, the county will make all efforts to expedite the determination. The denial of a PRC application due only to the expiration of the ten-day period is not an acceptable eligibility determination practice. The AG record should contain sufficient documentation of the case activity on the PRC application, including an explanation of unexpected or unavoidable delays in processing the application.

An assistance group that objects to a faith-based provider will be provided with an alternative provider of services. The alternative provider will be reasonably accessible and be able to provide comparable services.

### **Notice of Approval/Denial**

If it is determined that an application for PRC is approved, the CDJFS shall mail or otherwise deliver the ODHS 4074,"Notice of Approval of Your Application for Assistance." If it is determined that an application for PRC is denied, the CDJFS shall mail or otherwise deliver the ODHS 7334,"Notice of Denial of Your Application for Assistance."

All payments are made to the vendor in accordance with the procedures in place at the CDJFS. The agency will not reimburse any monies for any items for which payment has been made.

**Overpayment Procedures**

Methods of overpayment will include a lump-sum repayment or a monthly repayment agreement. All overpayments will be referred to the Benefit Recovery Unit for collection. If an overpayment method is not chosen within 30 days from the date of notification, legal action may be taken to recover the overpayment and the entire AG will be ineligible for PRC until restitution is made.

**Scope of Coverage**

The following sections describe the scope of benefits and services provided under the SCDJFS PRC program.

## **Chapter 1: Employment Related Needs**

This chapter has been suspended.

### **Income**

In order to qualify, the assistance group's gross income must be at or below the 150% of the Federal Poverty Level for that particular household size. For this chapter only, the amount of child support paid may be deducted from gross income to determine countable income; however, this may be done only if the child support has been paid regularly for a minimum of the past 6 months.

The items and services that may be provided under the PRC program below. This is not an all-inclusive list.

- Employment Related Clothing i.e., uniforms, special safety shoes
  - three estimates or suspended receipts are required and the need for employment-related clothing needs to be in writing on company letterhead, signed by a company representative or supervisor.
- Transportation Expenses i.e., TRIPS tickets for up to 4 months (the \$500 limit does not apply to TRIPS), bus tickets, car payments. **Note: Neither purchase of an automobile nor car repairs are to be covered under this chapter**
- Employment Related Counseling
- Short-term Education Expenses
- Job-related Expenses i.e., tools, safety equipment
  - three estimates or suspended receipts are required and the need for job-related expenses needs to be in writing on company letterhead, signed by a company representative or supervisor.

## **Chapter 2: Family Disaster Assistance**

This chapter has been suspended.

### **Income**

In order to qualify, the assistance group's gross income must be at or below the 200% of the federal poverty level for that particular household size.

Examples of the items and services, which may be provided under the PRC program, are listed below. This is not an all-inclusive list.

- Payment of emergency shelter or temporary housing for up to 30 days.
- Home Repair including purchase or repair of furnace or water tank; repair of items affecting basic home structure such as walls, roofing, plumbing, water supply, flooring, or water/sewage system. The individual applying for PRC must provide proof of home ownership. Exploration of home owners' insurance must also be utilized. The PRC applicant must secure three written estimates. The agency will authorize the lowest estimate.
- Homeowner's Insurance deductibles related to home repair costs
- Furniture including the purchase of bed, bed frame, mattress, box springs, couches, chairs and kitchen table and/or chairs. The PRC applicant must secure three written estimates. The agency will authorize the lowest estimate.
- Appliances including purchase or repair of stoves, refrigerators, heating stoves (if this is the household's only source of heat), air conditioners (if medically necessary as verified by a physician), fans, washer or dryer. The PRC applicant must secure three written estimates. The agency will authorize the lowest estimate.
- Household expenses including purchases of bedding, linen, cooking and eating utensils, vacuum cleaner, brooms and cleaning products. The PRC applicant must secure three written estimates. The agency will authorize the lowest estimate.
- Food vouchers up to \$500 to replace lost food
- Clothing up to \$100 per family member.

### **Chapter 3: Family Preservation and Reunification Services**

PRC payments may be issued for supportive services to promote family stability or to prevent placement in agency custody as the agency determines necessary and subject to the availability of unencumbered funds.

#### **Assistance Group Composition**

There is also potential eligibility for a pregnant individual under these services. Services under this chapter may also be provided for customers who do not reside in the county only if they have an open/active file with the PCSA division. These services are **ONLY** for families referred from the PCSA division and must be recommended by a supervisor or the administrator of that division.

Other services may be approved if, in the judgment of Sandusky County PCSA staff, those services will facilitate reunification of a child to his/her home or will prevent the need to remove a child from his/her home.

PRC cannot be used for any portion of the above named services that is covered under the Medicaid program.

#### **Income**

In order to qualify, the assistance group's gross income must be at or below the 300% of the federal poverty level for that particular household size. There may be situations where self-declaration of the income may be the only available verification of income.

#### **Application Process**

Application for Family Preservation and Reunification services may be made by an adult family member, his designee or a Public Children Service Agency representative applying on behalf of a child. An ODJFS 7200, Application for Cash, Medical, and Food Stamp Assistance, can also serve as the PRC application.

## **Chapter 4: Help Me Grow**

PRC funds will be used for the Help Me Grow Services. The Sandusky County Department of Job and Family Services will inform and refer OWF participants and non-OWF participants who have children who potentially meet the program eligibility requirements.

### **Income**

These families will remain in this program until their income exceeds 200% of the Federal Poverty Level for that particular household size. There may be situations where self-declaration of income may be the only available verification of income.

This program will automatically and immediately terminate if Help Me Grow Services funding is reduced or eliminated. The agency also agrees to execute a MOU or contract with the Sandusky County Board of Commissioners, the fiscal agent for the Sandusky County Family and Children First Council.

### **Application Process**

The appropriate Help Me Grow component application will serve as the PRC application.

## **Chapter 5: Housing/Shelter Expenses**

This chapter has been suspended.

### **Assistance Group Composition**

A pregnant individual with no other minor children in the home potentially may be eligible for these services. At least one adult member of the household must be employed at least 20 hours per week at federal minimum wage or working less than 20 hours per week with earnings equal to the federal minimum wage multiplied by 20 hours per week, or in receipt of unemployment compensation benefits (UCB). If the household is in receipt of public assistance benefits, any adults who potentially have work requirements must be active participants and meeting all assigned hours. Adults who are currently in school enrolled in a course of study related to a demand occupation; or who, if unemployed have been unemployed 6 months or less and are actively seeking new employment may also be eligible for these services. Actively seeking employment is defined as utilizing the Job Store services 3 times within the past 30 days. Those households whose only source of income is from a source other than those mentioned above are ineligible (such as but not limited to SSI, SSD, etc.)

### **Residence**

Residency is established by living in the county in a permanent housing arrangement; households residing in transitional housing do not meet the requirements for the services provided in this chapter. Transitional housing is defined as living in a household of a family member until permanent housing can be established.

### **Income**

In order to qualify, the assistance group's gross income must be at or below 200% of the federal poverty level for that particular household size.

### **Scope of Services**

Examples of the items and services, which may be provided under the PRC program, are listed below. This is an all-inclusive list.

- First month's rent and/or security deposit for a household moving from the Sandusky County homeless shelter (Liberty Center) or a battered women's shelter, or a household designated as homeless by another community service agency. In order to be eligible for this service, the household must have resided in Sandusky County at the time the homeless situation occurred.
- Up to 3 months previous past due rent payments or past due mortgage payments to prevent pending eviction or foreclosure. This payment may include lot rent and any late fees. The pending foreclosure must be verified through documentation from the lender. The eviction must be verified through documentation of a court date.
  - It should be noted that future ability to pay on-going rent/mortgage would be considered when determining eligibility for this service.

**NOTE: The above services can be utilized only 1 time in a 24-month period.**

- PRC assistance may be used to provide assistance to Sandusky County residents who heat with bulk fuel (propane and oil), natural gas, or electric. Households must first apply for Emergency HEAP and/or HEAP during the months of November thru March. Written verification of the Emergency HEAP and/or HEAP approval or denial is required. If the denial is for the household's failure to comply with HEAP or E-HEAP, PRC will be denied. Households that are ineligible for E-HEAP or HEAP may apply anytime during the months of November through June. Applications will be taken until a total of \$120,000 has been expended on utility costs or until June 30, whichever comes first. The applicant must provide an original, current utility statement in the household member's name, which verifies the outstanding balance after the E-HEAP and/or HEAP payment is applied, if applicable. If in a disconnect status or having less than a 10-day supply of bulk fuel, a determination of eligibility for E-HEAP must be made prior to a PRC determination. Eligibility is limited to the actual amount required to prevent disconnection, or for a minimum of bulk fuel, up to \$1000, 1 time in a 12 month period. Additionally, the household must have made at least 1 payment within the past 3 months prior to application.
  - It should be noted that future ability to pay on-going utility bills will be considered when determining eligibility for this service (use current budget for rent/mortgage assistance).
  - Households may be exempt from the work requirements, and employment and/or schooling requirements of this chapter. Households whose income is from a source other than employment or UCB, such as SSI, RSDI, Child Support, etc., may be potentially eligible for PRC utility assistance.
- PRC payments may be issued for the purchase of school clothing to provide clothing to youth enrolled and attending primary or secondary school (grades K-12, not home schooled), to increase the likelihood of retention in school. Eligibility is limited to minor children who have not attained age nineteen and are full-time students in a primary or secondary school (grades K-12, not home schooled). An eligible child must be living in the home of a specified relative (as defined in H.B. 408), legal guardian, or legal custodian.
  - Examples of the items and services, which may be provided under the PRC program, are listed below. This is an all-inclusive list. Allowable Purchases include the following items:

**Please note that this program will not pay for swimsuits, athletic uniforms, sleepwear or school supplies such as book bags, pens, pencils, etc.**

- The voucher will be written to cover only the items on the list above.

- Vouchers are a one-time use and should be kept with the receipts to be returned to the Sandusky County Department of Job and Family Services.
- This assistance will be made available from October 1, or until a total of \$190,000 has been expended on school clothes, whichever comes first. Eligibility is limited to \$150 per eligible child residing in the home at the time of application.
- This service can be utilized 1 time in a 24-month period.
- Households may be exempt from the work requirements, and employment and/or schooling requirements for the School Clothing Program. Households whose income is from a source other than employment or UCB, such as SSI, RSDI, Child Support, etc., may be potentially eligible for the School Clothing Program.

## **Chapter 6: Migrant Work Allowance Program**

This chapter has been eliminated.

## **Chapter 7: Economic Development**

PRC monies will be made available to aid in the advancement of the economic growth in Sandusky County. There are various ways that PRC monies could be beneficial to this cause. Those items that could be covered, but are not limited to, include the following:

- Job fairs
- Job training
- Bonuses to employers
- Mentoring bonus programs
- Employment Retention
- Employee Education/Recruitment

The specific plan for the appropriate item will be completed at the applicable time with the involved parties. Approvals for the expenditure of monies under this program will be at the discretion of the SCDJFS director.

## **Chapter 8: After School/Literacy Programs**

PRC funds may be made available to fund special after school and/or literacy programs. It is the goal that such programs will offer academic enrichment and work skill training to school age children in order to decrease the dropout rate and to prevent OWF dependency. These same programs could also encourage minor parents to remain in school and will assist with the implementation of intervention programs for younger adolescents to avoid early pregnancies. It should be noted that PRC funds will not be used to pay for direct educational services or traditional classroom instruction.

### **Income**

Eligibility for PRC funding will be limited to those households who are at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. In some instances, self-declaration of income may be the only available verification of income. Those households who have been verified to be eligible for the free and reduced school lunch program will meet the income requirement for PRC.

### **Application Process**

The application for the free and reduced school lunch program or the “Prevention, Retention, and Contingency” application form will be used as the application for these programs.

## **Chapter 9: Workforce Development**

TANF monies may be issued to adults who are employed at least 20 hours per week at federal minimum wage or working less than 20 hours per week with earnings equal to the federal minimum wage multiplied by 20 hours per week and earning at least \$592 during the month of June 2011 in order to help families obtain self-sufficiency. Under this program, eligible households could qualify for a one-time gift card to Wal-Mart to purchase household and employment related items excluding alcohol and tobacco products.

### **Assistance Group Composition**

Food assistance groups including at least one parent or legal guardian and one minor child (who has not attained age nineteen and is a full-time student in a secondary school or in the equivalent level of vocational or technical training) who were in receipt of food assistance during the month of June 2011 and who were employed at least 20 hours per week at federal minimum wage or working less than 20 hours per week with earnings equal to the federal minimum wage multiplied by 20 hours per week and earning at least \$592 during the month of June 2011 in order to help families obtain self-sufficiency and who are Sandusky County residents at the time of PRC application.

### **Residence**

Residence in Sandusky County is a requirement. Households who received food assistance in June 2011 from Sandusky County and are not residents of Sandusky County now will not be eligible for this program.

### **Income**

The PRC assistance group must have met the income guidelines to have been in receipt of food assistance during June 2011.

### **Application Process**

The Sandusky County PRC application or other appropriate application will serve as the application for this program and eligibility for the program will be determined by Sandusky County DJFS staff.

### **Scope of Services**

Services include a Wal-Mart gift card to purchase household needs such as clothing, shoes, toiletries, car repairs, gasoline, etc. excluding alcohol and tobacco products.

All purchases must be made by October 31, 2011. Gift cards will be surrendered at the time of purchase and any remaining balance(s) will be forfeited and returned to the Sandusky County Department of Job and Family Services.

## **Chapter 10: TANF-WIA Supplement**

WIA incentive and WIA supplemental dollars will be used for workforce development services for TANF eligible individuals.

### **Income**

In order to qualify, the assistance group's gross income at the date of application must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. OWF participants automatically will be program eligible.

### **Application Process**

The household's application for TANF benefits will serve as the application for TANF-WIA Supplement Services, and the application will be good for one (1) year.

## **Chapter 11: Kinship Navigator**

PRC funds will be used for the Kinship Navigator Program.

### **Income**

In order to be eligible for Kinship Navigator Services, the income of the child (ren) for whom the assistance is being requested must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. This program will automatically and immediately terminate if Kinship Navigator funding is reduced or terminated.

### **Application Process**

The Kinship Navigator application will serve as the PRC application.

## **Chapter 12: Wellness**

PRC funds will be used for the Wellness Program.

### **Income**

Wellness services may be provided to Sandusky County residents without regard to income. This program will automatically and immediately terminate if funding is reduced or terminated.

### **Application Process**

The Wellness application will serve as the PRC application.

## **Chapter 13: Diversion Services**

This chapter has been eliminated.

### **Assistance Group Composition**

A pregnant individual with no other children may be eligible for this program.

### **Income**

In order for the assistance group to be found eligible for Diversion Services, the assistance group's gross income must be at or below the 200% of the federal poverty level for that particular household size.

### **Application Process**

Eligibility will be carefully evaluated on a case-by-case basis. Upon receipt of a completed application, the county will make an eligibility determination within 30 calendar days. If the household is determined eligible for assistance, the CDJFS will mail or otherwise deliver the ODHS 4074, "Notice of Approval of Your Application for Assistance." This will be a one-time notice. If the assistance group is determined to be ineligible for assistance, the CDJFS will mail or otherwise deliver the ODHS 7334, "Notice of Denial of Your Application for Assistance."

Upon determination that an assistance group is eligible for Diversion Services, a check will be issued via a county payroll. The check will be for the amount of one verified specific crisis situation or episode of need for that particular household size and will be issued for the length of the specific crisis situation or episode of need; or the length of the disability, whichever time period is shorter.

The items and/or services that may be provided under this chapter are listed below. This is not an all inclusive list.

- Mortgage payment and Homeowners Insurance
- Rent payment and Renter's Insurance
- Utilities
- Car Payments and Car Insurance

### **Time Limit**

Once a household has received assistance under this program, they become ineligible to receive PRC assistance again under this program for a period of 12 months. The twelve-month period begins with the initial month of eligibility.

The Sandusky County Department of Job and Family Services agrees to implement the PRC plan as written. The county reserves the right to amend its plan at any time. Written verification will be submitted with any and all further PRC plan amendments. A copy of the plan and any amendments will be available at the agency for public inspection.
