## MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR FEBRUARY 2007

### OHIO WORKS FIRST (OWF)

For the month of February 2007, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 77,871; recipients totaled 166,321 and money payments totaled \$25,276,238. The percent change from January 2007 to February 2007 was -1.5% for assistance groups; -2.1% for recipients, and -2.6% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 74,738 assistance groups; 153,574 recipients, and \$23,926,643 in money payments issued for February 2007. The percent change from January 2007 to February 2007 was -1.5% for assistance groups; -2.2% for recipients, and -2.6% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,133; recipients, 12,747 and money payments were \$1,349,595. The percent change from January 2007 to February 2007 was -1.0% for assistance groups; -0.9% for recipients and -2.8% for money payments.

### FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,696 children received \$13,904,623 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of February 2007. Included in this total were 6,327 foster care children who received \$5,926,920 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,768 or 10.3% were in foster family homes who received \$1,076,082 and 3,559 or 13.2% children in child care institutions who received \$4,850,837 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,642 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,977,703 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$515.58.

### DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of February 2007, there were 13,635 assistance groups; 13,709 recipients, and \$1,847,646 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$134.78. Total DA expenditures for medical services for February 2007 were \$1,805,316. Of this total, \$1,293,893 or 71.7% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$367,091 or 20.3% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 3,820 recipients for an average expenditure of \$472.60 per recipient.

### FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES BENEFITS (FNS)

Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during February 2007 decreased to 1,054,032 by 20,705 or -1.9% from 1,074,737 persons reported in January 2007. Households decreased by or -1.8% over January 2007 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during January 2007 decreased by \$2,077,050 or -1.9% from \$107,705,366 reported in January 2007 to \$105,628,316 reported in February 2007. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$.01 or -0.0% from those issued in January 2007. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$100.22 reported in January 2007 to \$100.21 reported in February 2007.


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

# No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




# No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




# DA Cash Assistance Groups




