## MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR MARCH 2007

### OHIO WORKS FIRST (OWF)

For the month of March 2007, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 77,767; recipients totaled 165,777 and money payments totaled \$25,356,776. The percent change from February 2007 to March 2007 was -0.1% for assistance groups; -0.3% for recipients, and 0.3% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 74,612 assistance groups; 152,985 recipients, and \$23,971,956 in money payments issued for March 2007. The percent change from February 2007 to March 2007 was -0.2% for assistance groups; -0.4% for recipients, and 0.2% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,155; recipients, 12,792 and money payments were \$1,384,820. The percent change from February 2007 to March 2007 was 0.7% for assistance groups; 0.4% for recipients and 2.6% for money payments.

### FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,244 children received \$13,522,041 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of March 2007. Included in this total were 6,023 foster care children who received \$5,666,156 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,788 or 10.6% were in foster family homes who received \$1,294,585 and 3,235 or 12.3% children in child care institutions who received \$4,371,572 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,221 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,855,885 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$515.24.

### DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of March 2007, there were 13,890 assistance groups; 13,965 recipients, and \$1,952,139 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$139.79. Total DA expenditures for medical services for March 2007 were \$1,817,982. Of this total, \$1,294,846 or 71.2% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$398,026 or 21.9% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 3,617 recipients for an average expenditure of \$502.62 per recipient.

### FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES BENEFITS (FNS)


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during March 2007 increased to 1,066,951 by 12,919 or 1.2% from 1,054,032 persons reported in February 2007. Households increased by or 1.2% over February 2007 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during March 2007 increased by \$1,829,096 or 1.7% from \$105,628,316 reported in February 2007 to \$107,457,412 reported in March 2007. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$.50 or 0.5% from those issued in February 2007. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$100.21 reported in February 2007 to \$100.71 reported in March 2007.

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

# No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




# No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




# DA Cash Assistance Groups




