MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR APRIL 2005

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of April 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 85,106; recipients totaled 186,834 and money payments totaled \$25,550,561. The percent change from March 2005 to April 2005 was -1.4% for assistance groups; -1.7% for recipients, and -1.7% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 80,828 assistance groups; 169,563 recipients, and \$23,862,670 in money payments issued for April 2005. The percent change from March 2005 to April 2005 was -1.3% for assistance groups; -1.6% for recipients, and -1.5% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,278; recipients, 17,271 and money payments were \$1,687,891. The percent change from March 2005 to April 2005 was -3.1% for assistance groups; -2.6% for recipients and -4.1% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,063 children received \$13,460,634 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of April 2005. Included in this total were 7,169 foster care children who received \$5,905,175 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,175 or 11.7% were in foster family homes who received \$1,385,376 and 3,994 or 14.8% children in child care institutions who received \$4,519,799 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,894 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,555,458 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$497.38.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of April 2005, there were 14,628 assistance groups; 14,734 recipients, and \$1,895,414 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$128.64. Total DA expenditures for medical services for April 2005 were \$ 5,011,486. Of this total, \$3,517,745 or 70.2% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,172,699 or 23.4% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 11,715 recipients for an average expenditure of \$427.78 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during April 2005 decreased to 1,005,898 by 11,903 or -1.2% from 1,017,801 persons reported in March 2005. Households decreased by 5,715 or -1.3% over March 2005 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during April 2005 decreased by \$ 2,960,195 or -3.0% from \$98,400,293 reported in March 2005 to \$95,440,098 reported in April 2005. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$ 1.80 or -1.9% from those issued in March 2005. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$96.68 in March 2005 to \$94.88 in April 2005.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




