## MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR JULY 2004

### OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of July 2004, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 86,379; recipients totaled 191,707 and money payments totaled \$26,056,206. The percent change from June 2004 to July 2004 was -0.6% for assistance groups; -0.8% for recipients, and -1.0% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 82,379 assistance groups; 175,492 recipients, and \$24,518,267 in money payments issued for July 2004. The percent change from June 2004 to July 2004 was -0.5% for assistance groups; -0.5% for recipients, and -0.7% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,000; recipients, 16,215, and money payments were \$1,537,939. The percent change from June 2004 to July 2004 was -3.0% for assistance groups; -3.3% for recipients and -5.6% for money payments.

### FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,446 children received \$14,462,718 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of July 2004. Included in this total were 8,197 foster care children who received \$7,246,015 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,367 or 12.3% were in foster family homes who received \$1,277,450 and 4,830 or 17.6% children in child care institutions who received \$5,968,565 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,249 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,216,703 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$526.95.

### DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of July 2004, there were 12,847 assistance groups; 12,952 recipients, and \$1,650,143 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$127.40. Total DA expenditures for medical services for July 2004 were \$ 4,693,186. Of this total, \$3,327,758 or 70.9% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,071,835 or 22.8% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 10,702 recipients for an average expenditure of \$438.53 per recipient.

### FNS BENEFITS:

Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during July 2004 decreased to 961,345 by 9,590 or -0.6% from 966,742 persons reported in June 2004. Households decreased by 2,583 or -0.6% over June 2004 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during July 2004 decreased by \$ 644,178 or -0.7% from \$86,088,824 reported in June 2004 to \$85,444,646 reported in July 2004. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$.17 or -0.2% from those issued in June 2004. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$89.05 in June 2004 to \$88.88 in July 2004.





# No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




# No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




# DA Cash Assistance Groups




