MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR AUGUST 2005

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of August 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 83,406; recipients totaled 181,603 and money payments totaled \$25,158,179. The percent change from July 2005 to August 2005 was 0.8% for assistance groups; 1.0% for recipients, and 1.4% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 79,624 assistance groups; 166,397 recipients, and \$23,669,346 in money payments issued for August 2005. The percent change from July 2005 to August 2005 was 0.8% for assistance groups; 1.0% for recipients, and 1.4% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,782; recipients, 15,206 and money payments were \$1,488,833. The percent change from July 2005 to August 2005 was 1.2% for assistance groups; 1.3% for recipients and 1.5% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,563 children received \$13,470,540 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of August 2005. Included in this total were 6,379 foster care children who received \$5,701,553 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,819 or 10.7% were in foster family homes who received \$1,227,725 and 3,560 or 13.4% children in child care institutions who received \$4,473,828 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,184 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,768,987 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$507.12.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of August 2005, there were 12,622 assistance groups; 12,716 recipients, and \$1,518,756 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$119.44. Total DA expenditures for medical services for August 2005 were \$ 5,238,648. Of this total, \$3,701,427 or 70.7% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,190,783 or 22.7% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 9,737 recipients for an average expenditure of \$538.01 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during August 2005 increased to 1,028,817 by 14,581 or 1.4% from 1,014,236 persons reported in July 2005. Households increased by 7,354 or 1.6% over July 2005 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during August 2005 increased by \$2,412,861 or 2.5% from \$96,263,324 reported in July 2005 to \$98,676,185 reported in August 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$ 1.00 or 1.1% from those issued in July 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$94.91 in July 2005 to \$95.91 in August 2005.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




