MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR AUGUST 2006

OHIO WORKS FIRST (OWF)

For the month of August 2006, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 81,742; recipients totaled 176,360 and money payments totaled \$26,728,354. The percent change from July 2006 to August 2006 was 2.9% for assistance groups; 3.3% for recipients, and 2.9% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 78,078 assistance groups; 161,518 recipients, and \$25,149,711 in money payments issued for August 2006. The percent change from July 2006 to August 2006 was 2.9% for assistance groups; 3.4% for recipients, and 2.9% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,664; recipients, 14,842 and money payments were \$1,578,643. The percent change from July 2006 to August 2006 was 2.3% for assistance groups; 2.8% for recipients and 2.4% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,084 children received \$13,842,955 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of August 2006. Included in this total were 6,396 foster care children who received \$5,826,631 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,012 or 11.1% were in foster family homes who received \$1,316,028 and 3,384 or 12.5% children in child care institutions who received \$4,510,603 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,688 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$8,016,324 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$511.11.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of August 2006, there were 14,128 assistance groups; 14,220 recipients, and \$2,026,360 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$142.50. Total DA expenditures for medical services for August 2006 were \$2,817,958. Of this total, \$1,950,931 or 69.2% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$664,753 or 23.6% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 5,095 recipients for an average expenditure of \$553.08 per recipient.

FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES BENEFITS (FNS)


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during August 2006 increased to 1,072,753 by 8,384 or 0.8% from 1,064,369 persons reported in July 2006. Households increased by 4,156 or 0.9% over July 2006 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during August 2006 increased by \$991,776 or 0.9% from \$106,503,524 reported in July 2006 to \$107,495,300 reported in August 2006. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$0.15 or 0.1% from those issued in July 2006. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$100.06 reported in July 2006 to \$100.21 reported in August 2006.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




