MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR SEPTEMBER 2004

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of September 2004, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 87,167; recipients totaled 193,606 and money payments totaled \$26,073,048. The percent change from August 2004 to September 2004 was 0.3% for assistance groups; 0.3% for recipients, and -0.5% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 83,167 assistance groups; 177,276 recipients, and \$24,510,896 in money payments issued for September 2004. The percent change from August 2004 to September 2004 was 0.3% for assistance groups; 0.2% for recipients, and -0.6% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,030; recipients, 16,330 and money payments were \$1,562,152. The percent change from August 2004 to September 2004 was 0.5% for assistance groups; 1.2% for recipients and 1.0% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,126 children received \$13,810,598 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of September 2004. Included in this total were 7,701 foster care children who received \$6,507,386 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,122 or 11.5% were in foster family homes who received \$1,279,663 and 4,579 or 16.9% children in child care institutions who received \$5,227,724 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,425 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,303,211 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$509.13.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of September 2004, there were 12,907 assistance groups; 13,006 recipients, and \$1,653,854 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$127.16. Total DA expenditures for medical services for September 2004 were \$ 7,168,441. Of this total, \$5,070,728 or 70.7% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,719,331 or 24.0% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 14,974 recipients for an average expenditure of \$478.73 per recipient.


FNS BENEFITS:

Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during September 2004 decreased to 966,523 by 2,420 or -0.3% from 968,953 persons reported in August 2004. Households decreased by 859 or -0.2% over August 2004 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during September 2004 decreased by \$ 348,817 or -0.4% from \$86,716,053 reported in August 2004 to \$86,367,236 reported in September 2004. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$.13 or -0.2% from those issued in August 2004. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$89.49 in August 2004 to \$89.36 in September 2004.



No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Month




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




