MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR SEPTEMBER 2006

OHIO WORKS FIRST (OWF)

For the month of September 2006, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 80,584; recipients totaled 173,284 and money payments totaled \$26,500,449. The percent change from August 2006 to September 2006 was -1.4% for assistance groups; -1.7% for recipients, and -0.9% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 77,115 assistance groups; 159,269 recipients, and \$24,982,385 in money payments issued for September 2006. The percent change from August 2006 to September 2006 was -1.2% for assistance groups; -1.4% for recipients, and -0.7% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,469; recipients, 14,015 and money payments were \$1,518,064. The percent change from August 2006 to September 2006 was -5.3% for assistance groups; -5.6% for recipients and -3.8% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,121 children received \$13,730,291 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of September 2006. Included in this total were 6,422 foster care children who received \$5,743,164 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,907 or 10.7% were in foster family homes who received \$1,266,278 and 3,515 or 13.0% children in child care institutions who received \$4,476,887 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,699 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,987,126 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$506.26.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of September 2006, there were 13,869 assistance groups; 13,960 recipients, and \$ 1,816,230 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$130.10. Total DA expenditures for medical services for September 2006 were \$2,155,802. Of this total, \$1,531,224 or 71.0% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$492,150 or 22.8% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 4,652 recipients for an average expenditure of \$463.41 per recipient.

FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES BENEFITS (FNS)


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during September 2006 decreased to 1,064,886 by 7,867 or -0.7% from 1,072,753 persons reported in August 2006. Households decreased by 3,028 or -0.6% over August 2006 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during September 2006 decreased by \$1,104,785 or -1.0% from \$107,495,300 reported in August 2006 to \$106,390,515 reported in September 2006. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$0.30 or -0.3% from those issued in August 2006. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$100.21 reported in August 2006 to \$99.91 reported in September 2006.



No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




