MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR OCTOBER 2005

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of October 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 83,658; recipients totaled 182,264 and money payments totaled \$27,028,682. The percent change from September 2005 to October 2005 was -0.2% for assistance groups; -0.3% for recipients, and 7.7% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 79,777 assistance groups; 166,513 recipients, and \$25,360,810 in money payments issued for October 2005. The percent change from September 2005 to October 2005 was -0.2% for assistance groups; -0.5% for recipients, and 7.5% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,881; recipients, 15,751 and money payments were \$1,667,872. The percent change from September 2005 to October 2005 was 1.3% for assistance groups; 2.1% for recipients and 10.7% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,029 children received \$13,946,486 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of October 2005. Included in this total were 6,778 foster care children who received \$6,185,688 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,952 or 10.9% were in foster family homes who received \$1,231,834 and 3,826 or 14.2% children in child care institutions who received \$4,953,854 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,251 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,760,798 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$515.98.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of October 2005, there were 12,171 assistance groups; 12,257 recipients, and \$1,572,501 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$128.29. Total DA expenditures for medical services for October 2005 were \$ 3,902,775. Of this total, \$2,763,010 or 70.8% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$ 871,134 or 22.3% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 8,438 recipients for an average expenditure of \$462.52 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during October 2005 increased to 1,041,114 by 10,993 or 1.1% from 1,030,121 persons reported in September 2005. Households increased by 5,370 or 1.2% over September 2005 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during October 2005 increased by \$ 5,956,097 or 6.0% from \$98,491,845 reported in September 2005 to \$104,447,942 reported in October 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$ 4.71 or 4.9% from those issued in September 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$95.61 in September 2005 to \$100.32 in October 2005.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




