MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR DECEMBER 2005

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of December 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 84,457; recipients totaled 184,798 and money payments totaled \$28,157,960. The percent change from November 2005 to December 2005 was -0.0% for assistance groups; 0.1% for recipients, and 1.4% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 80,336 assistance groups; 168,095 recipients, and \$26,315,386 in money payments issued for December 2005. The percent change from November 2005 to December 2005 was -0.2% for assistance groups; -0.2% for recipients, and 1.1% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,121; recipients, 16,703 and money payments were \$1,842,574. The percent change from November 2005 to December 2005 was 3.6% for assistance groups; 3.0% for recipients and 5.7% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,903 children received \$14,353,892 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of December 2005. Included in this total were 6,524 foster care children who received \$6,536,050 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,894 or 10.8% were in foster family homes who received \$1,365,470 and 3,630 or 13.5% children in child care institutions who received \$5,170,579 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,379 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,817,842 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$533.54.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of December 2005, there were 12,023 assistance groups; 12,107 recipients, and \$1,661,825 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$137.26 Total DA expenditures for medical services for December 2005 were \$ 3,529,929. Of this total, \$2,480,848 or 70.3% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$ 780,526 or 22.1% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 7,726 recipients for an average expenditure of \$456.89 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during December 2005 increased to 1,055,074 by 13,671 or 1.3% from 1,041,403 persons reported in November 2005. Households increased by 5,473 or 1.2% over November 2005 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during December 2005 increased by \$1,589,609 or 1.5% from \$103,589,082 reported in November 2005 to \$105,178,691 reported in December 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$.22 or 0.2% from those issued in November 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$ 99.47 in November 2005 to \$99.69 in December 2005.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




