MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR OCTOBER 2006

OHIO WORKS FIRST (OWF)

For the month of October 2006, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 80,428; recipients totaled 173,086 and money payments totaled \$26,761,660. The percent change from Septemebr 2006 to October 2006 was -0.2% for assistance groups; -0.1% for recipients, and 1.0% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 77,023 assistance groups; 159,372 recipients, and \$25,271,659 in money payments issued for October 2006. The percent change from September 2006 to October 2006 was -0.1% for assistance groups; 0.1% for recipients, and 1.2% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,405; recipients, 13,714 and money payments were \$1,490,001. The percent change from September 2006 to October 2006 was -1.8% for assistance groups; -2.1% for recipients and -1.8% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,108 children received \$13,947,005 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of October 2006. Included in this total were 6,379 foster care children who received \$5,921,375 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,905 or 10.7% were in foster family homes who received \$1,356,384 and 3,474 or 12.8% children in child care institutions who received \$4,564,991 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,729 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$8,025,630 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$514.50.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of October 2006, there were 13,637 assistance groups; 13,718 recipients, and \$ 1,707,917 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$124.50. Total DA expenditures for medical services for October 2006 were \$2,161,630. Of this total, \$1,497,300 or 69.3% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$509,852 or 23.6% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 4,528 recipients for an average expenditure of \$477.39 per recipient.

FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES BENEFITS (FNS)


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during October 2006 increased to 1,067,925 by 3,039 or 0.3% from 1,064,886 persons reported in September 2006. Households increased by 1,827 or 0.4% over September 2006 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during October 2006 increased by \$2,035,171 or 1.9% from \$106,390,515 reported in September 2006 to \$108,425,686 reported in October 2006. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$1.62 or 1.6% from those issued in September 2006. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$99.91 reported in September 2006 to \$101.53 reported in October 2006.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




