## MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR NOVEMBER 2006

### OHIO WORKS FIRST (OWF)

For the month of November 2006, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 78,913; recipients totaled 169,001 and money payments totaled \$25,591,161. The percent change from October 2006 to November 2006 was -1.9% for assistance groups; -2.4% for recipients, and -4.4% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 75,743 assistance groups; 156,220 recipients, and \$24,233,824 in money payments issued for November 2006. The percent change from October 2006 to November 2006 was -1.7% for assistance groups; -2.0% for recipients, and -4.1% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,170; recipients, 12,781 and money payments were \$1,357,337. The percent change from October 2006 to November 2006 was -6.9% for assistance groups; -6.8% for recipients and -8.9% for money payments.

### FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,828 children received \$13,607,688 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of November 2006. Included in this total were 6,093 foster care children who received \$5,624,369 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,804 or 10.5% were in foster family homes who received \$1,241,413 and 3,289 or 12.3% children in child care institutions who received \$4,382,955 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,735 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,983,319 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$507.22.

### DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of November 2006, there were 13,497 assistance groups; 13,578 recipients, and \$ 1,732,064 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$127.56. Total DA expenditures for medical services for November 2006 were \$2,493,512. Of this total, \$1,772,084 or 71.1% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$574,476 or 23.0% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 4,491 recipients for an average expenditure of \$555.22 per recipient.

### FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES BENEFITS (FNS)

Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during November 2006 decreased to 1,061,392 by 6,533 or -0.6% from 1,067,925 persons reported in October 2006. Households decreased by 2,815 or -0.6% over October 2006 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during November 2006 decreased by \$2,092,837 or -1.9% from \$108,425,686 reported in October 2006 to \$106,332,849 reported in November 2006. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$1.35 or -1.3% from those issued in October 2006. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$101.53 reported in October 2006 to \$100.18 reported in November 2006.


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

# No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




# No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




# DA Cash Assistance Groups




