NOTICE OF NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY AS TO STUDENTS

The Mansfield, Ohio Area Electrical Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students of the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship and loan programs, and athletic and other school administered programs.

Application Requirements

Persons applying for our electrical construction apprenticeship program must be at least 17 years of age, be a high school graduate, or on track to graduate in June, or have obtained a GED, have received one full credit in a high school Algebra 1 course. A \$25.00 application fee will be collected at the time of application. Persons applying for apprenticeship opportunities should:

- Be physically and mentally able to perform or learn to perform essential tasks to their job with or without reasonable accommodations.
- Able to get to and from worksites in Ashland, Crawford, Huron, Knox, Marion, Morrow, Richland, and Wyandot Counties.
- Able and willing to attend all related classroom training as required to complete their apprenticeship.
- Able to climb and work from ladders, scaffolds, poles, and towers of various heights.
- Able to crawl and work in confined spaces such as attics, manholes and crawl spaces.
- Able to read, hear and understand instructions and warnings.



APPLICATION DATES

Applications are accepted on the first working Tuesday of each month, from 1:00 PM to 4:30 PM at the JATC Training Center located at 67 South Walnut Street in Mansfield. In 2009, a special application period during January 19 through January 30, weekdays from 1:00 PM until 4:30 PM except Monday, which the application time will be extended until 7:00 PM. Applicants must be present to fill out the applications. A non-refundable \$25.00 application fee must accompany the application payable in cash or money order.

Documentation Needed

- High School Transcript
- Proof of completion of Algebra 1 or equivalent
- Proof of Graduation or GED
- A valid driver's license

Veterans may submit a DD-214 to

verify training and/or experience if they wish to receive consideration for such training/education.

- Other documents applicant may wish to have considered. Those with electrical construction experience may qualify for advanced standing in the program.

Personal Interview

Qualified applicants will be notified by mail of the scheduled date and time of their personal interview with the JATC Committee. Interviews are conducted in our Training Facility. Once interviewed, the applicant will be listed among those applicants qualified for selection for a period of two years from the date of interview.

Drug Testing

All selected applicants must submit to a drug test as per the NECA/IBEW Drug Policy and are subject to "reasonable cause testing".
