The **S**haring **H**ow **A**ccess to **R**esources **E**mpowers Network (SHARE Network) will be announced to the public in the fall, and the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services is looking for community-based and faith-based organizations to register their services now.

Through SHARE Network, job seekers and their families will soon be able to discover a wide range of support services offered by community-based and faith-based organizations. Information regarding these resources will be available through an online directory which brings together all service providers (including grassroots non-profits and government) who specifically support an individual's entrance, success and/or advancement in employment.

How SHARE Network Works:

Faith-based and community-based organizations become SHARE Network members by registering online at <www.ohioworkforce411.gov/sharenetwork.stm>. During the registration process, participating organizations will list the services they offer, their hours of operation and contact information.

Once announced to the public, individuals will then be able to search online for assistance by county, type of service and/or name of the service provider. Customers will be able to access SHARE Network from their home, library, school or any of Ohio's 90 local One-Stop centers.

As an online resource, SHARE Network will be continually updated. Share Network members will be able to update their own services at any time, and will also be periodically reminded via e-mail to review their entries.

Through SHARE Network, faith-based and community-based organizations will be able to increase awareness of their services and learn what other organizations offer.
