Registration Opens October 19 for OhioMeansJobs.com Regional Virtual Job Fairs in November

COLUMBUS, OHIO – Ohio Department of Job and Family Services Director Matt Damschroder announced today that Ohioans can begin registering on Wednesday, Oct. 19, for the [OhioMeansJobs.com](https://ohiojobs.com) Regional Virtual Job Fairs the agency is hosting on Nov. 2. Registering before the event will allow employers to view your resume in advance and possibly schedule a time to chat the day of the event.

“I encourage anyone looking for a job in Ohio to take advantage of this opportunity,” Damschroder said. “More than 100 employers from a wide range of industries have already signed up to participate. All of them have open positions that they’re looking to fill now.”

The job fairs will take place from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. They are organized by region – one for each quadrant of the state – so job seekers can connect with employers in the area they’d like to work. Here’s how to participate:
