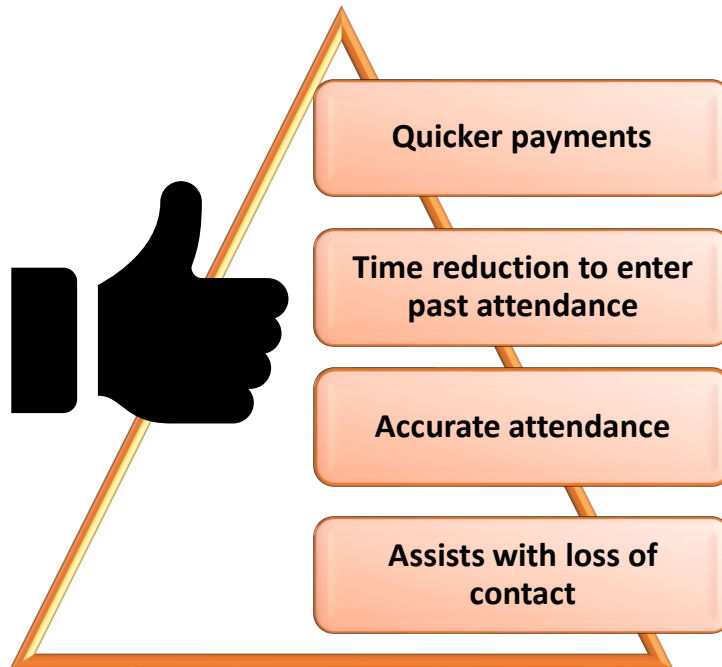


## Tips for Providers Who Serve Families That Have Applied for Publicly Funded Child Care

Ohio Administrative Code 5101:2-16-09(C)(1), requires all programs who are approved to provide publicly funded child care (PFCC) services to families to track attendance in the automated child care system: Time, Attendance and Payment (TAP).

Did you know that [creating a private pay schedule](#), through TAP, can be used to record attendance for children while a PFCC application is in process? There are several benefits to creating a private pay account for families including hassle free submission of attendance for payment.

### Benefits of creating a private pay account for families that have a PFCC application in process:



If a child starts attending your program while a PFCC application is in process, it is beneficial to create a private pay child and sponsor/caretaker record to track attendance. This allows you to track attendance in real time and saves the sponsor/caretaker from having to enter multiple weeks of attendance for you to receive payment.

Once authorized, the primary caretaker will automatically be added to KinderConnect and the child will have two schedules, a private pay and a PFCC. [You can merge the private pay schedule with the PFCC authorization](#), including a payment after denial authorization. Both the sponsor/caretaker and child records will need to be merged.
