**Provider Technical Assistance Letter 12
Moderate and Serious Risk Non-Compliance Reductions and Removal Guidelines
for Step Up To Quality for Family Child Care Home Providers
December 31, 2016
Updated October 1, 2018**

Background

Moderate Risk Non-Compliances (MRNC) and Serious Risk Non-Compliances (SRNC) for Family Child Care Home providers are outlined in Appendix A in rule 5101:2-13-03 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). MRNCs are assigned a point value of three and SRNCs are assigned a point value of six. All non-compliances not identified as a MRNC or a SRNC are considered low-risk and are valued as one point. MRNCs and SRNCs are cited as non-compliances during a program's licensing inspection and may impact the Step Up To Quality (SUTQ) rating.

In order for a program to be considered for a SUTQ star rating, the child care program cannot have been cited for a six-point SRNC or have a total of eighteen MRNC and/or SRNC points in the previous twelve months prior to the registration date and between the registration date and the awarded star rating.

As outlined in the SUTQ rule 5101:2-17-04 of OAC, once rated, if a program has a non-compliance that is a six-point SRNC or accumulates eighteen MRNC and/or SRNC points over twelve months, the SUTQ rating may be impacted. Low risk non-compliance points are not included in the accumulation.

Process

If a program disagrees with licensing non-compliance findings then the program may submit a Request for Review by submitting the JFS 01155 "Request for Review for Licensing and Step Up To Quality" within seven business days of the receipt of the licensing report per OAC 5101:2-12-03 (F)(1). This allows for the opportunity to request that any MRNCs and/or SRNCs be reviewed in order to be overturned to prevent the SUTQ rating from potentially being impacted.

If the licensing non-compliance(s) are not overturned or if the time period to request a licensing review has passed and the JFS 01155 was not submitted, the licensing non-compliance(s) that are MRNCs and SRNCs are reviewed to determine if a SUTQ rating reduction or removal is warranted. The Corrective Action Plan (CAP) submitted for the licensing violation is also reviewed and all applicable factors are considered.

A program is notified when a reduction or removal is determined. If the program disagrees with the reduction/removal of the SUTQ star rating, the program may submit the JFS 01155 "Request for Review for Licensing and Step Up To Quality" within seven business days of the receipt of the SUTQ reduction or removal letter per OAC 5101:2-17-05 (B).

Changes

The attached matrix is utilized as a guide by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) to ensure consistent consequences for programs that have a six-point SRNC or MRNC and/or SRNC non-compliances that total twenty-four points or more. This point increase from eighteen to twenty-four points is the result of stakeholder feedback received during the SUTQ five-year review Clearance process. The SUTQ amended rules, effective January 6, 2019, will reflect this change as well. The ODJFS will continue to monitor the impact to programs due to the MRNC and/or SRNC citations and the appropriateness and outcomes of this process for future consideration.

**Reduction and Removal Guidelines for Step Up To Quality (SUTQ)
for Family Child Care Home Providers
OAC rule 5101:2-13-03- Appendix A (Effective 10/1/2018)**

Any non-compliance may result in a stricter penalty based on the scope and severity of the incident. Factors taken into consideration include, but are not limited to:

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The intent of the person responsible for the action. • The age of the child and their dependency on an adult. • If the incident was self-reported. • If the FCC had similar licensing violations in the past. • Provider awareness or involvement in the risk or incident. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The length of time over which a child’s safety was at risk. • Whether or not this is a re-occurring incident. • The location of the incident and the additional risk resulting from that location. • What corrective action was taken to ensure safety of children would not be compromised again. • If there was a serious incident or serious injury to a child as defined in Chapter 13 |
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If the FCC receives a:	Then:
Warning	No action will be taken to reduce or remove the star rating; however, six SRNC points will be documented and count towards the 12-month total.
Rating Reduction	The FCC must wait 6 months before registering for a change of rating, or if reduced to a zero, 6 months before they can register to be rated.
Rating Removal	The FCC must wait 12 months before they can register to be rated.

For any 6 point SRNC citation listed below, the Family Child Care program may have a rating reduction or removal as outlined below:

As a result of the 2-star transition, if a provider's star rating is scheduled to be reduced to a 2-star rating pursuant to the tiered rating reduction described above, the provider will instead be reduced to a 1-star rating.
