

BCCD Registered Day Camp Sweep Summary 2008

On Thursday June 26, 2008 the Child Care Licensing Section staff conducted an onsite Day Camp Sweep to 75 programs across the state while the supervisors conducted desk reviews of background check documents for 25 programs*. BCCD engaged in a massive communication effort to inform Day Camps of their background check responsibility for staff. Camps that did not meet the statutory requirements at the time of the monitoring were given 30 days to provide verification of final compliance. The results of the sweep after the final compliance follow-up showed these compliances:

58 (60%) Day Camps in Compliance
 39 (40%) Day Camps out of Compliance
 1254 Staff working in Day Camps
 994 (79%) Staff in Compliance
 260 (21%) Staff out of Compliance**

The percentage of compliance improved from 27% for the number of Day Camps and 9% for staff from last year. This is a significant improvement over last year as the sample from last year was a total of 26 camps and this year's sample was 103 camps.

*Of the 103 camps, 6 were not in operation.

**the majority of the staff non-compliances this year were due to the verification of the 5 year residence needing to be documented. Of the 260 staff that were out of compliance, 179 or 69% were out of compliance due to not having the 5 year proof of residency on file. These 179 staff did, however, have the BCII completed and on file. This was the first year BCCD conducted monitoring on the 5 year residency requirement.

Of the three camps needing follow up from the summer of 07 review, 2 were out of compliance due to not having the 5 year proof of residency on file. Their staff did have the BCII background checks on file.

This year ODJFS MIS (Management Information Systems) created a "real time" tracking tool that supervisors across the state used to document compliance information. This information provided the statistical data for use in comparison reporting. Additionally, this was the first year that results were posted on the BCCD website under each individual Day Camp. Future plans include enhancement of the child care web site information, additional public information related to the 5 year residency requirement and more standardized information to be provided to the OCF Help Desk for responses to public inquiries.
