MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR JANUARY 2005

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of January 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 86,654; recipients totaled 191,925 and money payments totaled \$26,090,925. The percent change from December 2004 to January 2005 was -1.3% for assistance groups; -1.5% for recipients, and -1.4% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 82,398 assistance groups; 174,590 recipients, and \$24,378,521 in money payments issued for January 2005. The percent change from December 2004 to January 2005 was -1.4% for assistance groups; -1.8% for recipients, and -1.7% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,256; recipients, 17,335 and money payments were \$1,712,404. The percent change from December 2004 to January 2005 was 2.2% for assistance groups; 1.7% for recipients and 2.5% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,914 children received \$13,778,606 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of January 2005. Included in this total were 7,172 foster care children who received \$6,274,320 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,094 or 11.5% were in foster family homes who received \$1,317,277 and 4,078 or 15.2% children in child care institutions who received \$4,957,043 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,742 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,504,286 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$511.95.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of January 2005, there were 14,008 assistance groups; 14,116 recipients, and \$2,036,299 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$144.25. Total DA expenditures for medical services for January 2005 were \$ 5,736,699. Of this total, \$4,013,928 or 70.0% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,333,220 or 23.2% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 14,136 recipients for an average expenditure of \$405.54 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during January 2005 increased to 1,007,283 by 10,697 or 1.1% from 996,586 persons reported in December 2004. Households increased by 4,122 or 0.9% over December 2004 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during January 2005 increased by \$ 63,041 or 0.1 from \$96,573,320 reported in December 2004 to \$96,636,361 reported in January 2005. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$.96 or -1.0% from those issued in December 2004. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$96.90 in December 2004 to \$95.94 in January 2005.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Month




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




