MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR FEBRUARY 2005

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of February 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 85,882; recipients totaled 189,522 and money payments totaled \$25,968,641. The percent change from January 2005 to February 2005 was -0.9% for assistance groups; -1.3% for recipients, and -0.5% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 81,600 assistance groups; 172,216 recipients, and \$24,251,217 in money payments issued for February 2005. The percent change from January 2005 to February 2005 was -1.0% for assistance groups; -1.4% for recipients, and -0.5% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,282; recipients, 17,306 and money payments were \$1,717,424. The percent change from January 2005 to February 2005 was 0.6% for assistance groups; -0.2% for recipients and 0.3% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,963 children received \$15,420,724 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of February 2005. Included in this total were 8,202 foster care children who received \$7,925,950 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,326 or 11.9% were in foster family homes who received \$1,502,223 and 4,876 or 17.4% children in child care institutions who received \$6,423,728 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,761 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,494,774 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$551.47.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of February 2005, there were 14,268 assistance groups; 14,379 recipients, and \$2,099,424 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$146.01. Total DA expenditures for medical services for February 2005 were \$ 5,805,818. Of this total, \$4,040,614 or 69.6% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,390,933 or 24.0% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 13,663 recipients for an average expenditure of \$424.93 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during February 2005 decreased to 988,011 by 19,272 or -1.9% from 1,007,283 persons reported in January 2005. Households decreased by 9,032 or -2.0% over January 2005 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during February 2005 decreased by \$ 2,796,928 or -2.9 from \$96,636,361 reported in January 2005 to \$93,839,433 reported in February 2005. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$.96 or -1.0% from those issued in January 2004. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$95.94 in January 2005 to \$94.98 in February 2005.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Month




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




