## MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR MAY 2004

### OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of May 2004, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 86,541; recipients totaled 192,454 and money payments totaled \$26,194,246. The percent change from April 2004 to May 2004 was -0.5% for assistance groups; -0.6% for recipients, and -0.1% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 82,299 assistance groups; 175,364 recipients, and \$24,510,455 in money payments issued for May 2004. The percent change from April 2004 to May 2004 was -0.3% for assistance groups; -0.3% for recipients, and 0.1% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,242; recipients, 17,090, and money payments were \$1,683,791. The percent change from April 2004 to May 2004 was -4.8% for assistance groups; -4.3% for recipients and -3.4% for money payments.

### FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,728 children received \$14,538,568 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of May 2004. Included in this total were 7,626 foster care children who received \$7,318,831 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,154 or 11.8% were in foster family homes who received \$1,375,618 and 4,472 or 16.7% children in child care institutions who received \$5,943,213 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,102 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,219,737 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$543.95.

### DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of May 2004, there were 12,904 assistance groups; 13,014 recipients, and \$1,717,225 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$131.95. Total DA expenditures for medical services for May 2004 were \$ 5,247,901. Of this total, \$3,659,292 or 69.7% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,301,251 or 24.8% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 12,018 recipients for an average expenditure of \$436.67 per recipient.

### FNS BENEFITS:

Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during May 2004 increased to 957,891 by 7,907 or 0.8% from 949,984 persons reported in April 2004. Households increased by 1,947 or 0.5% over April 2004 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during May 2004 increased by \$ 548,894 or 0.7% from \$84,433,387 reported in April 2004 to \$84,982,281 reported in May 2004. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$.16 or -0.2% from those issued in April 2004. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$88.88 in April 2004 to \$88.72 in May 2004.


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

# No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Month




# No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




# DA Cash Assistance Groups




