## MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR MAY 2005

### OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of May 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 83,274; recipients totaled 181,279 and money payments totaled \$24,995,872. The percent change from April 2005 to May 2005 was -2.2% for assistance groups; -3.0% for recipients, and -2.2% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 79,289 assistance groups; 165,279 recipients, and \$23,417,266 in money payments issued for May 2005. The percent change from April 2005 to May 2005 was -1.9% for assistance groups; -2.5% for recipients, and -1.9% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,985; recipients, 16,000 and money payments were \$1,578,606. The percent change from April 2005 to May 2005 was -6.8% for assistance groups; -7.4% for recipients and -6.5% for money payments.

### FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 27,224 children received \$14,305,678 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of May 2005. Included in this total were 7,253 foster care children who received \$6,716,316 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,031 or 11.1% were in foster family homes who received \$1,291,106 and 4,222 or 15.5% children in child care institutions who received \$5,425,210 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,971 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,589,362 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$525.48.

### DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of May 2005, there were 14,435 assistance groups; 14,539 recipients, and \$1,889,618 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$129.97. Total DA expenditures for medical services for May 2005 were \$ 4,979,906. Of this total, \$3,382,939 or 67.9% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,243,191 or 25.0% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 11,227 recipients for an average expenditure of \$443.57 per recipient.

### FNS BENEFITS:

Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during May 2005 increased to 1,023,138 by 17,240 or 1.7% from 1,005,898 persons reported in April 2005. Households increased by 7,627 or 1.7% over April 2005 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during May 2005 increased by \$2,805,359 or 2.9% from \$95,440,098 reported in April 2005 to \$98,245,457 reported in May 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$ 1.14 or 1.2% from those issued in April 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$94.88 in April 2005 to \$96.02 in May 2005.


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

# No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




# No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




# DA Cash Assistance Groups




# No of FNS Benefits Assistance Groups
