MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR JULY 2005

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of July 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 82,723; recipients totaled 179,724 and money payments totaled \$24,813,857. The percent change from June 2005 to July 2005 was -1.4% for assistance groups; -1.6% for recipients, and 1.0% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 78,986 assistance groups; 164,719 recipients, and \$23,347,150 in money payments issued for July 2005. The percent change from June 2005 to July 2005 was -1.3% for assistance groups; -1.4% for recipients, and 1.1% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,737; recipients, 15,005 and money payments were \$1,466,707. The percent change from June 2005 to July 2005 was -4.5% for assistance groups; -4.6% for recipients and -0.5% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,528 children received \$13,236,170 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of July 2005. Included in this total were 6,486 foster care children who received \$5,606,753 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,091 or 11.7% were in foster family homes who received \$1,426,786 and 3,395 or 12.8% children in child care institutions who received \$4,179,966 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,042 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,629,418 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$498.95.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of July 2005, there were 14,205 assistance groups; 14,303 recipients, and \$1,804,610 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$126.17. Total DA expenditures for medical services for July 2005 were \$ 4,109,407. Of this total, \$2,970,390 or 72.3% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$909,383 or 22.1% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 10,069 recipients for an average expenditure of \$408.12 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during July 2005 increased to 1,014,236 by 3,257 or 0.3% from 1,010,979 persons reported in June 2005. Households increased by 643 or 0.1% over June 2005 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during July 2005 increased by \$605,329 or 0.6% from \$95,657,995 reported in June 2005 to \$96,263,324 reported in July 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$.29 or 0.3% from those issued in June 2005. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$94.62 in June 2005 to \$94.91 in July 2005.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




