MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR AUGUST 2004

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of August 2004, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 86,893; recipients totaled 193,041 and money payments totaled \$26,208,767. The percent change from July 2004 to August 2004 was 0.6% for assistance groups; 0.7% for recipients, and 0.6% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 82,883 assistance groups; 176,900 recipients, and \$24,662,472 in money payments issued for August 2004. The percent change from July 2004 to August 2004 was 0.6% for assistance groups; 0.8% for recipients, and 0.6% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,010; recipients, 16,141 and money payments were \$1,546,295. The percent change from July 2004 to August 2004 was 0.3% for assistance groups; -0.5% for recipients and 0.5% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,794 children received \$13,646,981 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of August 2004. Included in this total were 7,397 foster care children who received \$6,337,501 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,081 or 11.5% were in foster family homes who received \$1,320,885 and 4,316 or 16.1% children in child care institutions who received \$5,016,616 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,367 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,309,480 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$509.33.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of August 2004, there were 13,020 assistance groups; 13,128 recipients, and \$1,718,500 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$130.90. Total DA expenditures for medical services for August 2004 were \$ 4,785,428. Of this total, \$3,446,243 or 72.0% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,052,117 or 22.0% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 11,829 recipients for an average expenditure of \$404.55 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during August 2004 increased to 968,953 by 7,608 or 0.8% from 961,345 persons reported in July 2004. Households increased by 4,078 or 1.0% over July 2004 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during August 2004 increased by \$1,271,407 or 1.5% from \$85,444,646 reported in July 2004 to \$86,716,053 reported in August 2004. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$.61 or 0.7% from those issued in July 2004. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$88.88 in July 2004 to \$89.49 in August 2004.

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

No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Month




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




