MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR SEPTEMBER 2005

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of September 2005, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 83,788; recipients totaled 182,726 and money payments totaled \$25,105,077. The percent change from August 2005 to September 2005 was 0.5% for assistance groups; 0.6% for recipients, and -0.2% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 79,957 assistance groups; 167,302 recipients, and \$23,598,932 in money payments issued for September 2005. The percent change from August 2005 to September 2005 was 0.4% for assistance groups; 0.5% for recipients, and -0.3% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 3,831; recipients, 15,424 and money payments were \$1,506,145. The percent change from August 2005 to September 2005 was 1.3% for assistance groups; 1.4% for recipients and 1.2% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,838 children received \$13,410,051 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of September 2005. Included in this total were 6,625 foster care children who received \$5,666,825 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 2,965 or 11.0% were in foster family homes who received \$1,208,400 and 3,660 or 13.6% children in child care institutions who received \$4,458,425 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 20,213 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,743,226 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$499.67.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of September 2005, there were 12,443 assistance groups; 12,539 recipients, and \$1,619,707 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$129.17. Total DA expenditures for medical services for September 2005 were \$ 4,062,661. Of this total, \$2,858,365 or 70.4% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$ 916,779 or 22.6% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 8,750 recipients for an average expenditure of \$464.30 per recipient.

FNS BENEFITS:


Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during September 2005 increased to 1,030,121 by 1,304 or 0.1% from 1,028,817 persons reported in August 2005. Households increased by 1,540 or 0.3% over August 2005 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during September 2005 decreased by \$ 184,340 or -0.2% from \$98,676,185 reported in August 2005 to \$98,491,845 reported in September 2005. The average benefit issuance per person decreased by \$.30 or -0.3% from those issued in August 2005. The average benefit issuance per person decreased from \$95.91 in August 2005 to \$95.61 in September 2005.



No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Months




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




