MONTHLY REVIEW OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE STATISTICS FOR OCTOBER 2004

OHIO WORKS FIRST

For the month of October 2004, OWF-Combined assistance groups totaled 87,592; recipients totaled 194,243 and money payments totaled \$26,809,627. The percent change from September 2004 to October 2004 was 0.5% for assistance groups; 0.3% for recipients, and 2.8% for money payments. For OWF- Regular (OWF-R) there were 83,504 assistance groups; 177,652 recipients, and \$25,165,130 in money payments issued for October 2004. The percent change from September 2004 to October 2004 was 0.4% for assistance groups; 0.2% for recipients, and 2.7% for money payments. For OWF-Unemployed (OWF-U) assistance groups totaled 4,088; recipients, 16,591 and money payments were \$1,644,497. The percent change from September 2004 to October 2004 was 1.4% for assistance groups; 1.6% for recipients and 5.3% for money payments.

FOSTER CARE (TITLE IV-E)

A total of 26,963 children received \$14,422,182 in Title IV-E assistance during the month of October 2004. Included in this total were 7,509 foster care children who received \$7,095,898 in money payments. Of these Title IV-E children, 3,185 or 11.8% were in foster family homes who received \$1,495,160 and 4,324 or 16.0% children in child care institutions who received \$5,600,738 in OWF foster care assistance. The remaining 19,454 children reported as participating in Title IV-E received \$7,326,283 in adoption assistance. Overall, the average amount of Foster Care received per child was \$534.89.

DISABILITY ASSISTANCE (DA)

For the month of October 2004, there were 12,985 assistance groups; 13,085 recipients, and \$1,785,256 in DA financial assistance. The average DA financial assistance per recipient was \$136.44. Total DA expenditures for medical services for October 2004 were \$ 6,716,924. Of this total, \$4,713,404 or 70.2% was spent for prescribed drugs, and \$1,657,857 or 24.7% was spent for physician services. Medical expenses were paid for 15,962 recipients for an average expenditure of \$420.81 per recipient.


FNS BENEFITS:

Total persons participating in the FNS benefits program during October 2004 increased to 974,870 by 8,347 or 0.9% from 966,523 persons reported in September 2004. Households increased by 4,205 or 1.0% over September 2004 levels. The total dollar value of FNS related benefits issued during October 2004 increased by \$7,132,359 or 8.3% from \$86,367,236 reported in September 2004 to \$93,499,595 reported in October 2004. The average benefit issuance per person increased by \$ 6.55 or 7.3% from those issued in September 2004. The average benefit issuance per person increased from \$89.36 in September 2004 to \$95.91 in October 2004.



No of OWF Combined Assistance Groups During The Last 25 Month




No of OWF Combined Recipients During The Last 25 Months




DA Cash Assistance Groups




