Dear Mayor Whaley:

This Firm is counsel for Economy Linen. Please forward all communications and materials to me.

Due to unforeseen and drastic events unfolding as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, Economy Linen is forced to lay off employees at its Dayton, Ohio Plant, located at 80 Mead St, Dayton, OH 45402, effective starting March 20, 2020. This is expected to be temporary, until around the time that bans on the hospitality providers serviced by Economy Linen are lifted. The entire plant will not be closed. No bumping rights exist in the affected positions.

Job titles of the affected positions, and the approximate number of affected employees in each job classification, include: Plant Production employees (60); Route Representatives (2); Office (3). The Union representatives of affected employees, Bob Smith, Teamsters Local 957 (Route Representatives), and Lisha Sly, Chicago Midwest Regional Joint Board/Workers United (Plant Production employees), have been copied on this letter and notified of the foregoing circumstances. Employees are being encouraged to file for unemployment compensation benefits.
